Jason Bordoff is Policy Director of the Hamilton Project, an economic policy initiative housed at The Brookings Institution committed to promoting more broadly shared prosperity. Jason has written on a broad range of economic policy matters, with a focus on climate and energy, trade and globalization, and tax policy. His publications include *Path to Prosperity* (Brookings Press 2008, with Jason Furman) and several journal articles, book chapters, op eds and policy papers.
