Mary Ellen Joyce is director of executive development at the Brookings Center for Executive Education.

Prior to joining Brookings, Mary Ellen was a Washington representative for the American Petroleum Institute. Previously, she served as executive assistant to former New Hampshire Governor John H. Sununu and was his liaison to the National Governors' Association during his tenure as chairman. Mary Ellen was appointed by President George Bush to the U.S. Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations, on which she served from 1989 to 1995.



A former account executive with the firm of Smith & Harroff, Inc., Mary Ellen managed the campaigns for Sununu in New Hampshire and developed the field network for Arizona Senator John McCain's 1982 race for the House of Representatives and 1986 contest for the United States Senate. In addition, she directed programs for several corporate clients including Westinghouse Electric Corporation. Her work for Westinghouse involved a nationwide public education program on nuclear power.

Mary Ellen also worked on the presidential campaign of former U.S. Senator Howard H. Baker and was on the legislative staff of former U.S. Senator Edward W. Brooke of Massachusetts. She received a Bachelors of Arts degree in political science from Boston College and a Ph.D. in public administration from the George Washington University. Her research interests include 21st century leadership competencies and public service motivation.
