

Chad P. Bown

Chad P. Bown is a Nonresident Fellow in the Global Economy and Development Program at the Brookings Institution, as well as Associate Professor in the Department of Economics and International Business School (IBS) at Brandeis University in Waltham, Massachusetts. He is a Term Member at the Council on Foreign Relations and currently serves as the Book Review Editor for the *World Trade Review*. He manages a trade policy transparency initiative for the World Bank via organization and dissemination of the Global Antidumping Database, and he is also currently an Adviser to the American Law Institute (ALI) project on the Principles of the Law of World Trade.



Bown has two books that will be published in 2009. The first is a monograph titled *Self-Enforcing Trade: Developing Countries, the WTO and Dispute Settlement* (Brookings Institution Press). The second is a volume co-edited with Joost Pauwelyn at the Graduate Institute in Geneva titled *The Law, Economics, and Politics of Trade Retaliation in WTO Dispute Settlement* (Cambridge University Press).

Bown's research spans the economics of international trade laws and institutions, trade policy negotiations, and trade frictions. His recent research examines WTO dispute settlement, the international use of antidumping and safeguard trade policies, the integration of China, India, and other developing countries into the global trading system. His policy pieces and commentary have been featured in *The Washington Post*, *The American*, and the *Chicago Fed's Economic Perspectives*. His recent research has been published in academic and policy journals such as the *Canadian Journal of Economics*, *Economics & Politics*, *European Journal of Political Economy*, *IMF Staff Papers*, *Journal of International Economic Law*, *Journal of International Economics*, *Journal of Legal Studies*, *Journal of World Trade*, *Oxford Review of Economic Policy*, *The Review of Economics and Statistics*, *World Bank Economic Review*, *The World Economy*, and *World Trade Review*.

For 2004-2005, Bown was the Okun-Model Visiting Fellow in Economic Studies at Brookings, and for 2007-2008 he was the visiting scholar in the Economic Research and Statistics Division in the World Trade Organization (WTO) Secretariat in Geneva, Switzerland. He has also been a visiting scholar at the World Bank in Washington, the Center for European Integration Studies (ZEI) in Bonn, Germany and the Swedish National Board of Trade (Kommerskollegium) in Stockholm. His research has received financial support through funding provided by the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation, the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, and the German Marshall Fund of the United States.

Bown holds a Ph.D. in Economics from the University of Wisconsin-Madison (1999), and a B.A. magna cum laude in Economics and International Relations from Bucknell University (1994).
