Michael Fullilove

Dr. Michael Fullilove is the Lowy Visiting Fellow in Foreign Policy Studies at the Brookings Institution in Washington, DC, and the Director of the Global Issues Program at the Lowy Institute for International Policy in Sydney, Australia. He writes widely on topics including U.S. and Australian foreign policy, diasporas and the international system, Asia and the Pacific, the U.N. and multilateral diplomacy, international law, state-building, human rights, and speech-making.

Dr. Fullilove's latest monograph is *World Wide Webs: Diasporas and the International System* (Lowy Institute, 2008), which argues that global diasporas are getting larger, thicker and stronger. Other recent publications have dealt with topics such as the new Australian Labor Government and the U.S.-Australia alliance, capital punishment in Australian foreign policy, state-building in the Pacific, and the U.N. and Asia. His first book, *'Men and Women of Australia!' Our Greatest Modern Speeches*, was published by Vintage in 2005.

Dr. Fullilove was a consultant to Frank Lowy AC on the establishment of the Lowy Institute and he has directed the Institute's Global Issues Program since 2003. Previously he worked as a lawyer and a volunteer in the U.N. mission in East Timor. In 1995-1996 he served as an adviser on the personal staff of Australian Prime Minister Paul Keating.

Dr. Fullilove graduated in international relations and law from the Universities of Sydney and New South Wales, with dual university medals. He also studied as a Rhodes Scholar at the University of Oxford, where he took a master's degree in international relations and wrote his doctorate on President Franklin D. Roosevelt's foreign policy. His dissertation was awarded the annual prize for the best international history thesis in Britain.

Dr. Fullilove has published more than seventy articles in publications such as *The Sydney Morning Herald*, *The Age*, *The Australian*, *The Australian Financial Review*, *The Times Literary Supplement*, *The International Herald Tribune*, *Slate*, the *Los Angeles Times*, the *Financial Times*, *The National Interest* and *Foreign Affairs*. He has been quoted in publications such as *The Yomiuri Shimbun*, *The South China Morning Post*, *The Wall Street Journal*, *Time Magazine*, *Newsweek*, *The Economist* and *The New York Times*, and he is a regular commentator for the Australian Broadcasting Corporation and CNN International.
