

Kenneth Rogoff

Kenneth Rogoff, a Nonresident Senior Fellow in the Global Economy and Development Program at Brookings, is a Thomas D. Cabot Professor of Public Policy and Professor of Economics at Harvard University. Rogoff is one of the world's leading experts on global economic issues. His treatise *Foundations of International Macroeconomics* is the standard text used in graduate courses throughout the world, and his monthly syndicated column on global economic issues is published in over 30 countries.



From 2001-2003, Rogoff served as Chief Economist and Director of Research at the International Monetary Fund. He is also a former Director of the Center for International Development at Harvard.

Rogoff is an elected member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, as well as a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and the Trilateral Commission. He holds the life title of international grandmaster of chess.
