Ruy Teixeira is a Visiting Fellow at The Brookings Institution, where he is co-directing a joint Brookings-American Enterprise Institute project on political demography and geography, *The Future of Red, Blue and Purple America*. He is also a Senior Fellow at The Century Foundation and the Center for American Progress, as well as a Fellow of the New Politics Institute.

He is the author or co-author of five books, including *The Emerging Democratic Majority*, *America's Forgotten Majority: Why the White Working Class Still Matters* and *The Disappearing American Voter*, as well as several hundred articles. He also writes the bi-monthly public opinion series, *What the Public Really Wants*, and the weekly feature, *Public Opinion Snapshot*, featured on the CAP and TCF websites.

Teixeira's book, *The Emerging Democratic Majority*, written with John Judis (Scribner, 2002), was the most widely-discussed political book of that year and generated praise across the political spectrum. It was selected as one of the best books of the year by *The Economist*.

Teixeira's most recent writings include *The Politics of Definition* (with John Halpin), *Back to the Future: The Emerging Democratic Majority Re-emerges* (with John Judis) and the New Politics Institute reports, *The Next Frontier: A New Study of Exurbia* and *The Progressive Politics of the Millennial Generation*.
