Adam Thomas is the research director for the Brookings Institution's Responsible Parenting Project, which is housed in the Economic Studies program's Center on Children and Families.



From 2002 to 2007, he pursued a Ph.D. in Public Policy at Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government, where he conducted dissertation research on the marital prospects of low-skilled men in the United States. While at Harvard, Dr. Thomas was awarded a Jacob K. Javits Doctoral Fellowship and an Inequality and Social Policy Doctoral Research Fellowship. He also served for four years as an economics instructor in the Kennedy School's Summer Program for mid-career graduate students. Prior to enrolling at Harvard, he was a Senior Research Analyst in the Economic Studies program at the Brookings Institution. His previous work at Brookings focused on family structure, welfare reform, and policies designed to assist low-income working families.

In addition to his Ph.D., Dr. Thomas holds master's degrees in policy studies from the University of Sussex and the University of Texas at Austin, and he holds a Bachelors Degree in political science from Birmingham-Southern College.
