Amy Liu is a senior fellow, co-director and co-founder of the Brookings Metropolitan Policy Program. Ms. Liu is a frequent speaker on ideas to advance U.S. economic competitiveness by building a next economy with state, federal, and private sector partners. She is also currently leading a new “practice” effort at Brookings to help civic, political and business leaders in metro areas adopt intentional, market-oriented economic strategies. Strategies include metropolitan business plans and metropolitan export plans to grow regional economies.

Ms. Liu has co-authored a number of Brookings publications, including “Delivering the Next Economy: The States Step Up.” She is also a frequent speaker and author on the rebuilding efforts in greater New Orleans and southern Louisiana post Hurricane Katrina. She is often cited for her co-authorship of the “The New Orleans Index at Five.”
