

Jane Nelson

Jane Nelson is a Senior Fellow at the Mossavar Rahmani Center for Business and Government and Director of the Corporate Social Responsibility Initiative, at the Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University. She serves as a Director at the Prince of Wales International Business Leaders Forum (IBLF), and is a Nonresident Senior Fellow in the Global Economy and Development Program at Brookings.



During 2001, Nelson worked in the executive office of the UN Secretary-General, Kofi Annan, preparing a report for the United Nations General Assembly on cooperation between the UN and the private sector, which supported the first GA resolution on such cooperation. Prior to joining the IBLF in 1993, Nelson was a Vice President at Citibank and responsible for marketing for the bank's Worldwide Securities Services business and Financial Institutions Group in Asia Pacific, Europe, and the Middle East. She has worked for the Business Council for Sustainable Development in Africa preparing a report for the 1992 Rio Earth Summit for FUNDES (Fundación para desarrollo sostenible) in Latin America undertaking research and co-authoring a book on small enterprise development, and for the United Nations Environment Programme, leading a global research project on business and sustainable development. In 1983, she was a lecturer in agricultural economics at the University of Natal in South Africa.

Nelson has authored a variety of books and publications on public-private partnerships and the changing role of business in society, especially in emerging markets, and co-authored four of the World Economic Forum's Global Corporate Citizenship reports. Her books and publications include: *Building Linkages for Competitive and Responsible Entrepreneurship* (2007); coauthor of *Profits with Principles: Seven strategies for delivering value with values* (2004); and coauthor of *Business and the Millennium Development Goals: A Framework for Action* (2003).

She serves on the boards of the World Environment Center, the ImagineNations Group, the International Council of Toy Industries CARE process, and the U.K. Environment Foundation; and on the leadership council of the Initiative for Global Development; the international advisory council of Instituto Ethos in Brazil; and the advisory committees for the World Economic Forum's Global Corporate Citizenship Initiative and Business Alliance Against Chronic Hunger. She is on the Faculty of Harvard Business School's Corporate Social Responsibility executive program and Cambridge University' Business and Poverty leadership program.

Born in Zimbabwe, Nelson has lived and worked in Africa, Asia, Europe, and North America, and has work experience in the Middle East and Latin America. She received a B.Sc. in Agricultural Economics with Honors from the University of Natal in South Africa, and an M.A. Politics, Philosophy and Economics from Oxford University, where she was a Rhodes Scholar.
