Peyton Young is a senior fellow in the Economic Studies program and is the James Meade Professor of Economics at the University of Oxford.



He is the author of *Strategic Learning and Its Limits* (Oxford University Press, 2004), *Social Dynamics* (ed. with Steven N. Durlauf, MIT Press, 2001), *Fair Representation: Meeting the Ideal of One Man, One Vote, 2nd Edition* (with M. L. Balinski, Brookings Institution Press), *Individual Strategy and Social Structure: An Evolutionary Theory of Institutions* (Princeton University Press, 1998), and *Equity In Theory and Practice* (Princeton University Press, 1994).

His current research is concerned with risks and rewards in the financial sector, and how to redesign regulations and incentives in order to guard against future systemic failures.

Professor Young is a former President of the Game Theory Society. He is also a Fellow of the British Academy, a Fellow of the Econometric Society, and an external faculty member of the Santa Fe Institute. He received his B.A. from Harvard University, a Ph.D. in mathematics from the University of Michigan, and an M.A. from the University of Oxford. Prior to joining Oxford he was Scott and Barbara Black Professor of Economics at Johns Hopkins University.

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
