Immigrants in the U.S.


- **■40** million immigrants
- ■11.9 million undocumented (2008)
- 7 million Mexican origin undocumented immigrants
- 2.7 million undocumented immigrants in CA; 500k in AZ
- 5.5 million children with at least one undocumented parent

Percent of adults who say they "approve".





Which of these two statements comes closer to your own views – even if neither is exactly right.


- 1. Immigrants today strengthen our country because of their hard work and talents OR






What Hispanics Were Hearing in Church (2007)
