



Relative Sizes of the Tea Party and Christian Conservative Movements



Overlap between the Tea Party and Christian Conservative Movements






<u>Conventional Wisdom</u>: The Tea Party movement is distinct from previous conservative movements like the Christian Right.

The Tea Party, Christian Conservatives, & Republican Identification






<u>Conventional Wisdom:</u> The Tea Party movement is an independent political force, whose members are not beholden to either political party.



<u>Conventional Wisdom</u>: The Tea Party movement is largely a political libertarian group that believes in maximum freedom for individuals.







The 2010 Vote Gap by Religion




Among registered voters



Variation in Support for Same-sex Marriage by Religion








Changes in Views on Gay & Lesbian Rights




Changes in Views on Abortion




Increasing Support for Same-sex Marriage 2006-2010

Two Closing Notable Findings



- A majority (54%) of voters say they would be more likely to vote for a candidate who supported health care reform.
- Nearly 6-in-10 (58%) Americans favor a policy that provides a future path to citizenship for undocumented immigrants who have been in the U.S. for several years.
 Three-quarters of Americans also say immigration reform policies should be decided at the national level.

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
