Scenario: Unmarried Individuals

➤ Unmarried male, age 23 who earns \$11,000 per year and meets the work requirement.

Current Benefit: \$0
Proposed Benefit: \$1,083
+ \$1,083 in incremental EITC


Non-custodial parent, age 27 who earns \$11,000 per year, meets the work requirement and is current on his child support.

Current Benefit: \$86 Proposed Benefit: \$1,083

+\$1,000 in incremental EITC benefit

Non-custodial parent, age 25 who earns \$15,000 per year, meets the work requirement, is current on his child support but owes arrears.

Current Benefit: \$0
Proposed Benefit: \$471
+ \$471 in incremental EITC



Scenario: Married Couples without Children

Married couple, without children earning \$11,000 jointly (\$5,500 each) and both meet the work requirement.

Current Benefit: \$239

Proposed Benefit: \$1,683 (combined)

+ \$1,444incremental EITC

➤ Married couple, without children earning \$22,000 jointly (\$11,000 each) and both meet the work requirement

Current Benefit: \$0

Proposed Benefit: \$2,166 (combined)


+\$2,166 incremental EITC

➤ Married couple, without children earning \$30,000 jointly (\$15,000 each) and both meet the work requirement.

Current Benefit: \$0

Proposed Benefit: \$942 (combined)

+\$942 incremental EITC



Scenario: Married Couples with Children

➤ Married couple with one child earning \$22,000 jointly (\$11,000 each) and the spouse not claiming the child meets the work requirement.

Current Benefit: \$1,918 (combined)
Proposed Benefit: \$3,830 (combined)

➤ Married couple with one child earning \$44,000 jointly (\$30,000 one spouse and \$14,000 other spouse), assuming the lower earning spouse does not claim the child and meets the work requirement.

Current Benefit: \$0 (combined)
Proposed Benefit: \$944 (combined)

➤ Married couple with 2 children earning \$22,000 jointly (\$11,000 each) and the spouse not claiming the children meets the work requirement.

Current Benefit: \$3,707 (combined)
Proposed Benefit: \$5,483 (combined)

➤ Married couple with 2 children earning \$44,000 jointly (\$30,000 and \$14,000 each), assuming the lower earning spouse does not claim the children and meets the work requirement.


Current Benefit: \$0 (combined)

Proposed Benefit: \$1,961 (combined)




Scenario: Impact of the Marriage Penalty
