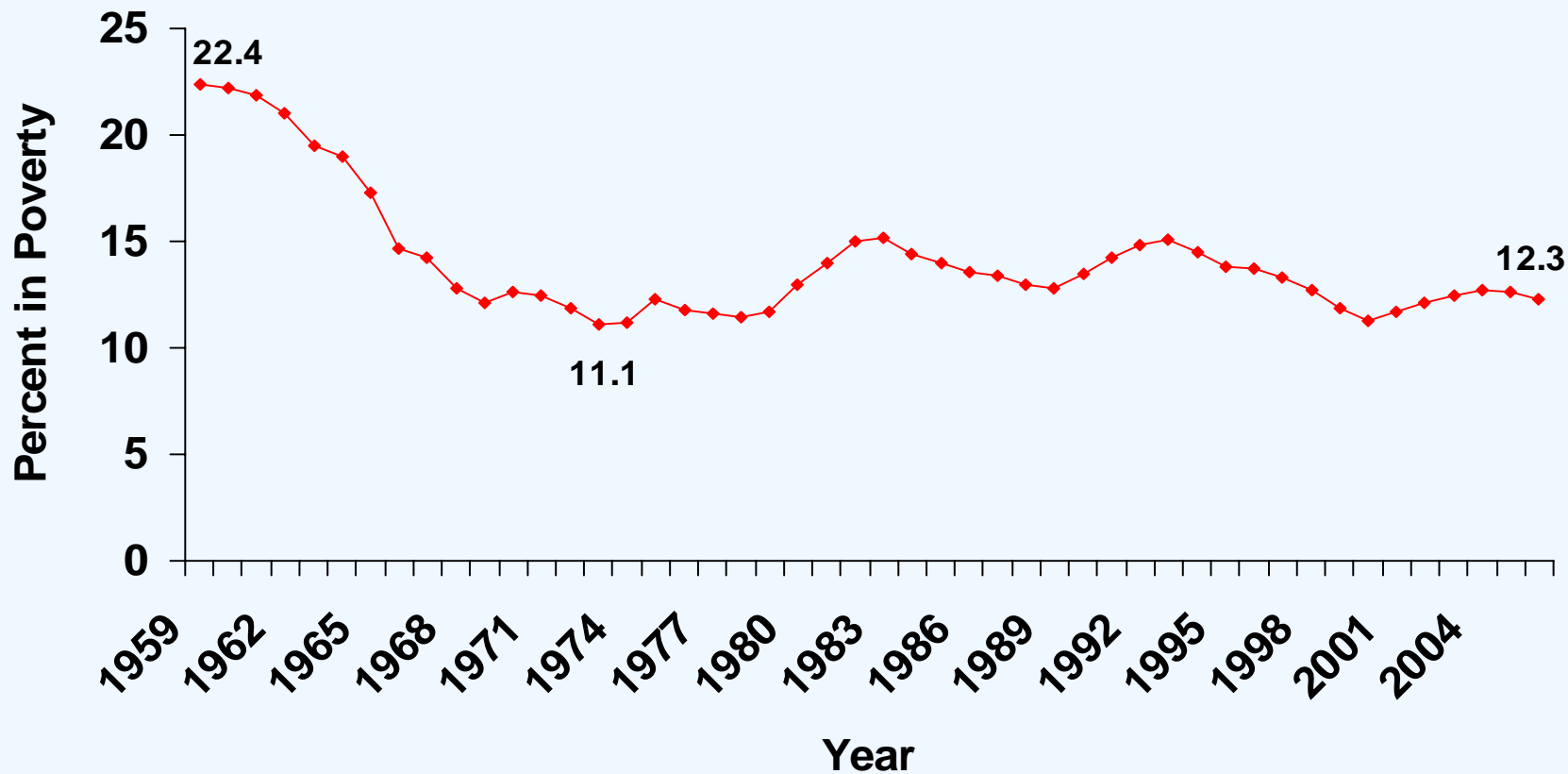

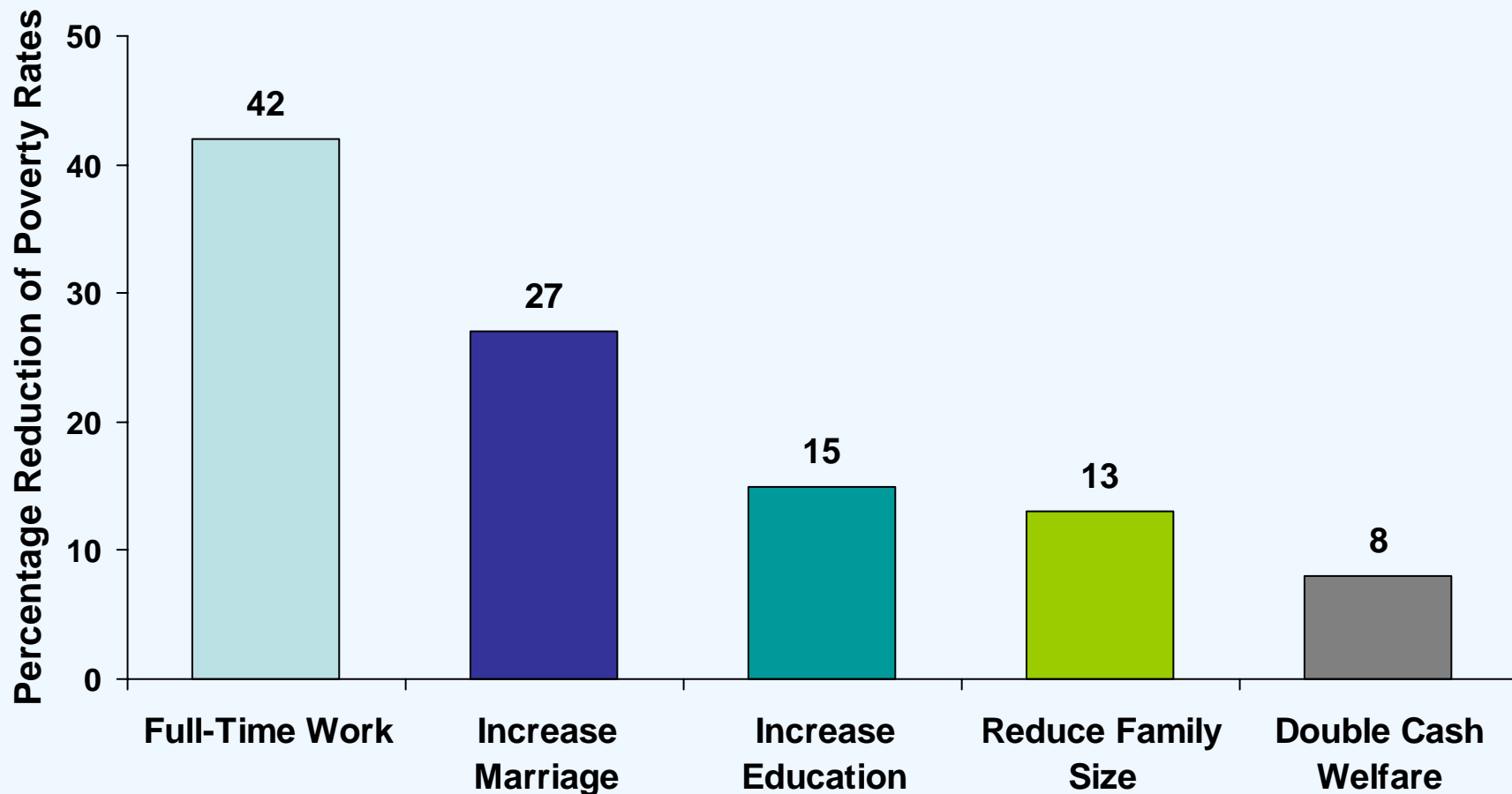


Poverty Is Stubborn, 1959-2006
