Before the earthquake

 In 2009, the cluster supported the Ministry of Education and DPC (Department of Civil Protection) to conduct three training workshops on the INEE MS throughout the country.



After the earthquake

- Widespread <u>dissemination</u> of the standards electronically and the handbooks (in English and French) to cluster partners.
- A <u>working group</u> was established in the initial stages of the response to agree on how the INEE MS would be adapted to the Haitian context.



MS Training in Haiti

 Standards were agreed with the Ministry of Education (focus on resume school activities).

 Use of INEE MS to develop guidelines for cluster partners and to monitor progress and identify gaps.



MS Training in Haiti

- National Training of Trainers workshop by UNICEF and STC
- Education in emergencies preparedness, response and risk reduction in Petit Goave
- With local authorities and NGOs from the departments most vulnerable to hurricanes.
- Based on the INEE Minimum Standards.
- Practical and technical components of education in emergencies including contingency planning and preparedness processes to mitigate the impact of disasters on schools and learners.

MS Training in Haiti

- Participants learn how they should be applied both in preparedness and response activities
- Training will be rolled-out in the six most cyclone-prone communes in Haiti in July and will include dedicated education contingency planning exercises for the cyclone season (June-November)



And now what?

- Risk: temptation to do tabula rasa
- Ambitious but realistic
- Not to rebuild the previous education system (no continuity-MS)
- Local factors to be considered:
 - low starting point
 - weak government
 - economy collapsed
 - donors perspective toward education

1. Foundational Standards

Participation and resources

Government / Ministry of Education (central and districts)
Encourage comunity participation (also in resources)

+\$10bn pledges in New York Conference (March)

Coordination

Ministry of Education with other ministries
Education Cluster, Groupe Sectoriel en Education
CIRH

Analysis (assessment, response strategies, monitoring, evaluation)



2. Access and Learning Environment

Standard 1: Equal Access

Private 90% vs Public 10% (25% of pupils)

Standard 2: Protection and well-being

Ensure respect of rules for construction

Standard 3: Facilities and Services

Collaboration needed with other sectors (government and international aid)



3. Teaching and Learning

Standard 1: Curricula

New curriculum to be done (by MoE) Include disaster preparedness

 Standard 2: Training, professional development and support

Pre-Service and In-Service Training

• Standard 3: Instruction

Textbooks / Creole + French Community involvement

Standard 4: Assessment of learning outcomes

EGRA (Early Grade Reading Assessment)

4. Teachers and Other Education Personnel

- Standard 1: Recruitment and selection
 300 teachers trained per year, 3,000 needed
 Increase inspection in private schools
- Standard 2: Conditions of work
 Compensation programs
 Improve salaries (average \$600 year)
- Standard 3: Support and supervision

MoE Capacity Development
Increase inspection in public and private school

5. Education Policy

Standard 1: Policy Formulation

Responsibility: Ministry of Education (avoid temptations to replace it)

Help the Ministry to achieve Education for All

Standard 2: Planning and Implementation

Use international agreements to improve education: EFA Goals, MDGs, right to education...

Respect of national laws: construction, fees in public schools...

Timeline 2015?

Civil society participation: PTA, Unions, NGOs...
