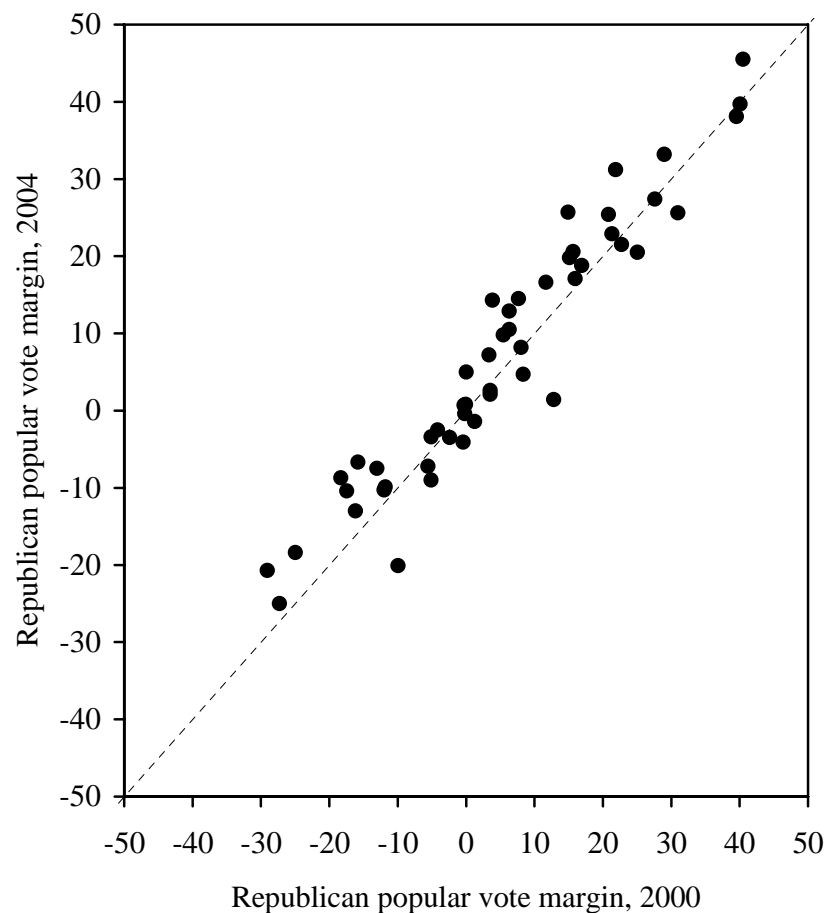
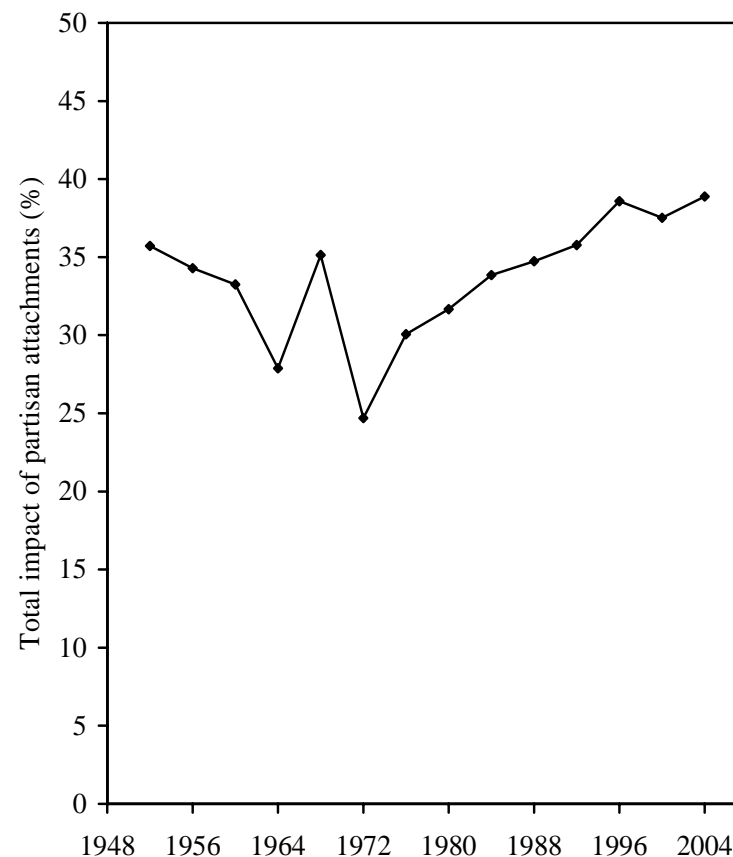

Partisan Voting in Presidential Elections, 1952-2004

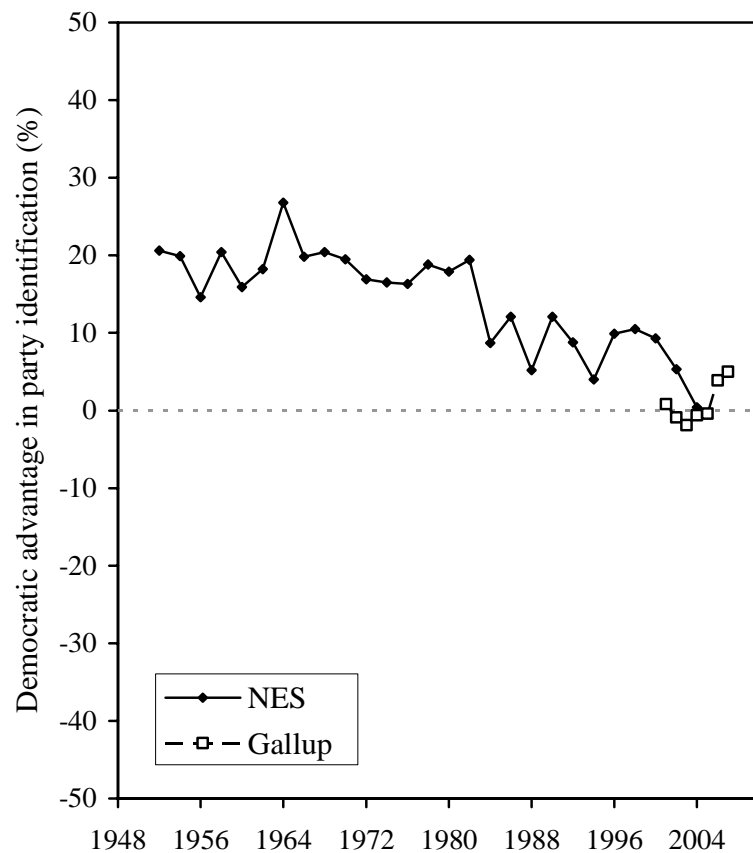

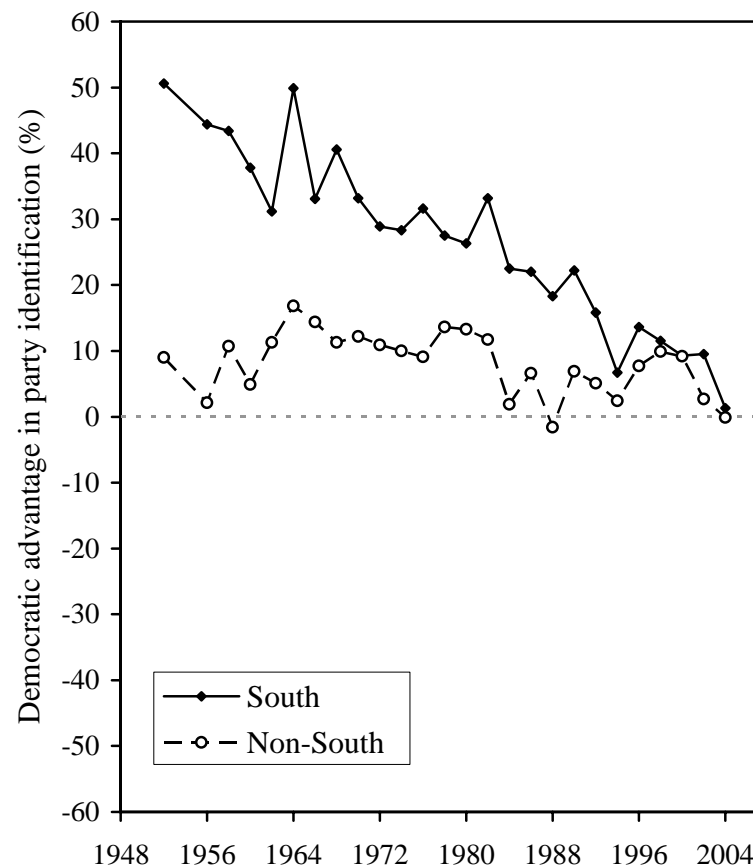

Democratic Advantage in Party Identification, South and Non-South, 1952-2004

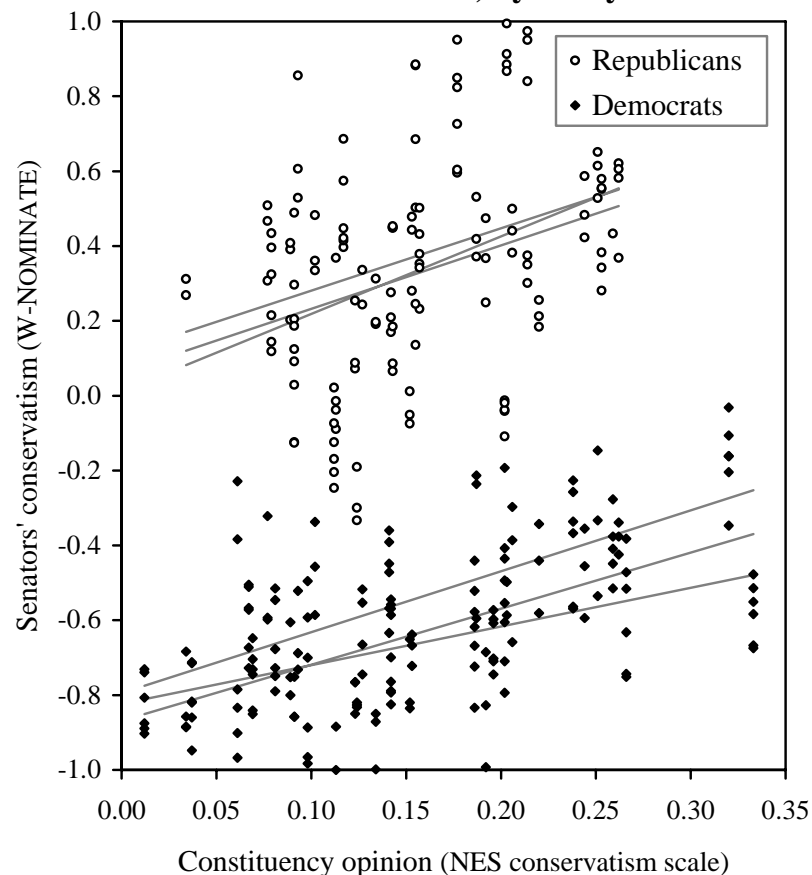

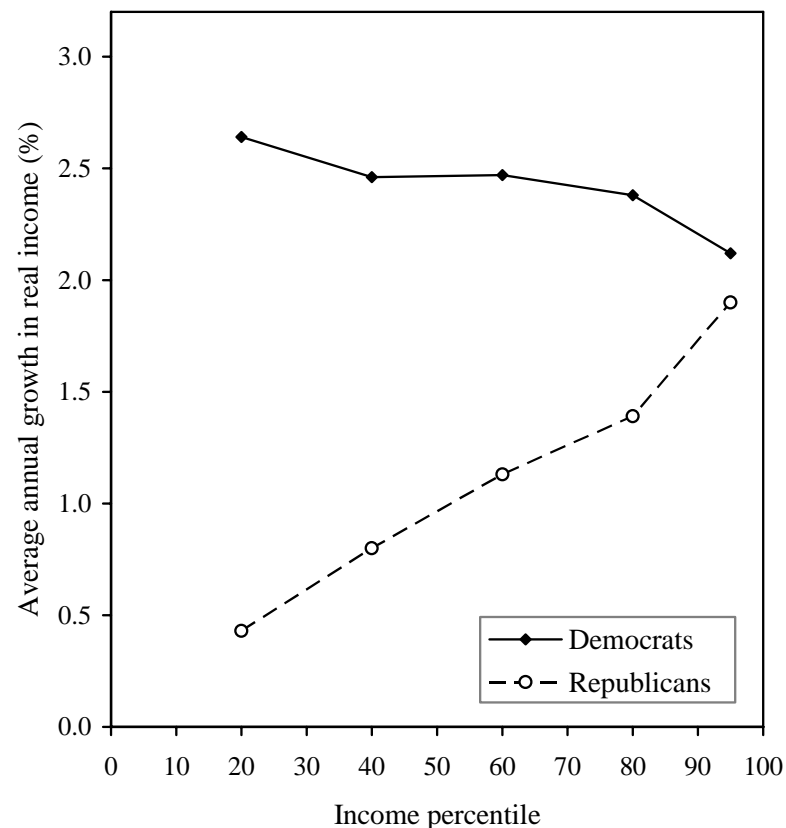
