Current Adopted Bike Plan: The City of Copenhagen's BiCyCle sTraTegy 2011-2025 Municipal policy aspires for 40% of commuters to travel by bike by 2012, and 50% by 2015.

Status of Bike Infrastructure: A system of interconnected green bicycle routes and greenways are under development to create a fast, safe, and pleasant means of transport.
