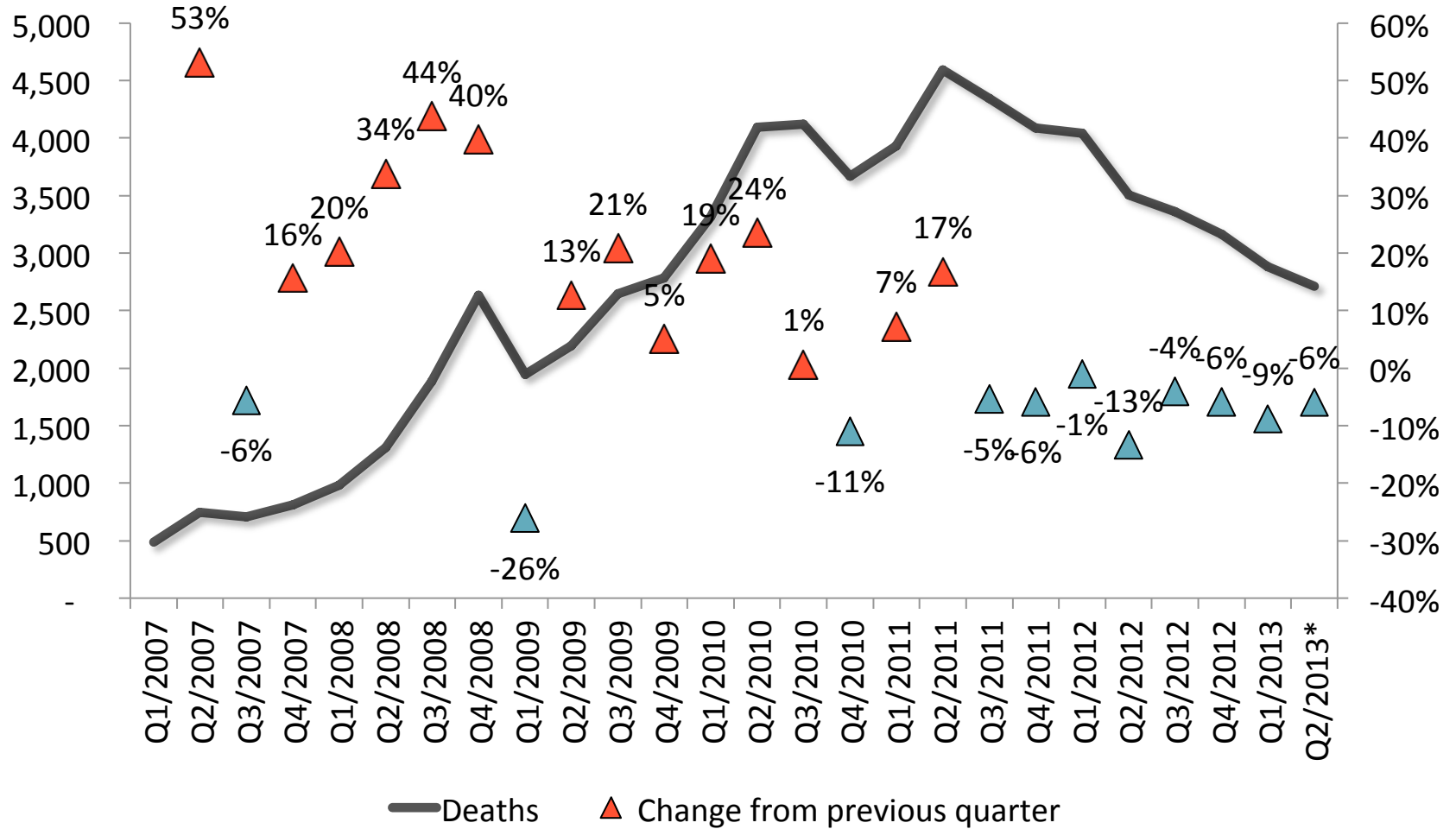

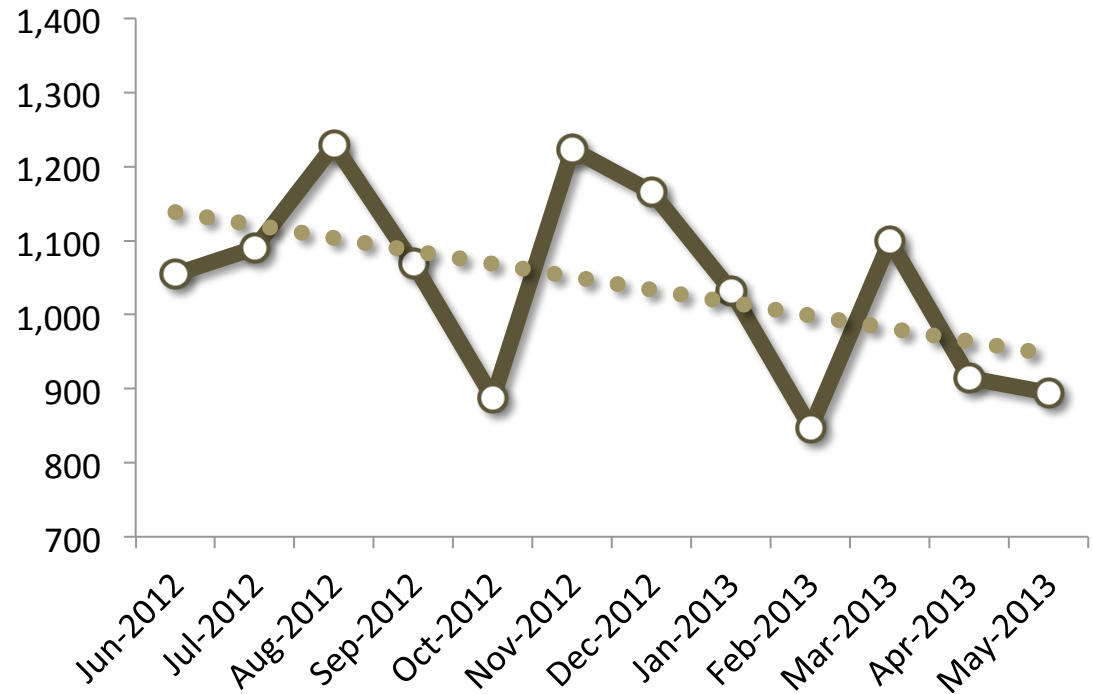
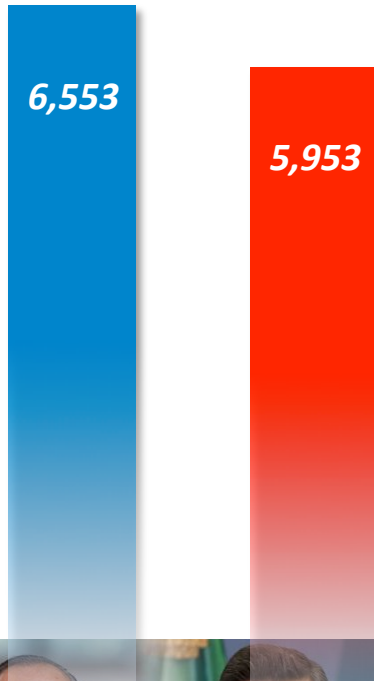
Quarterly Organized Crime-Related Deaths

(Calderón's last semester/Peña Nieto's first semester)



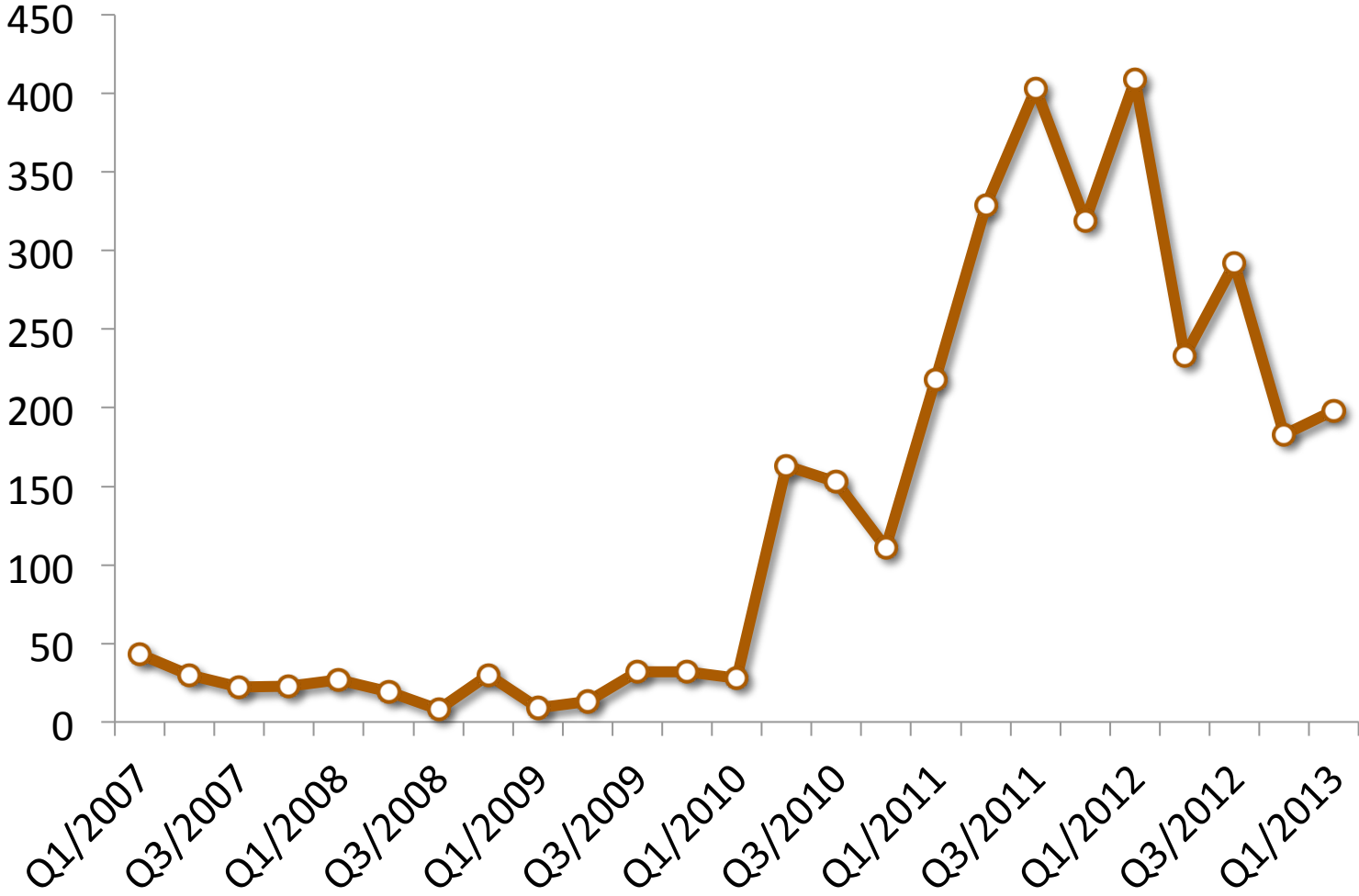

Quarterly Organized Crime-Related Deaths Monterrey Metropolitan Area

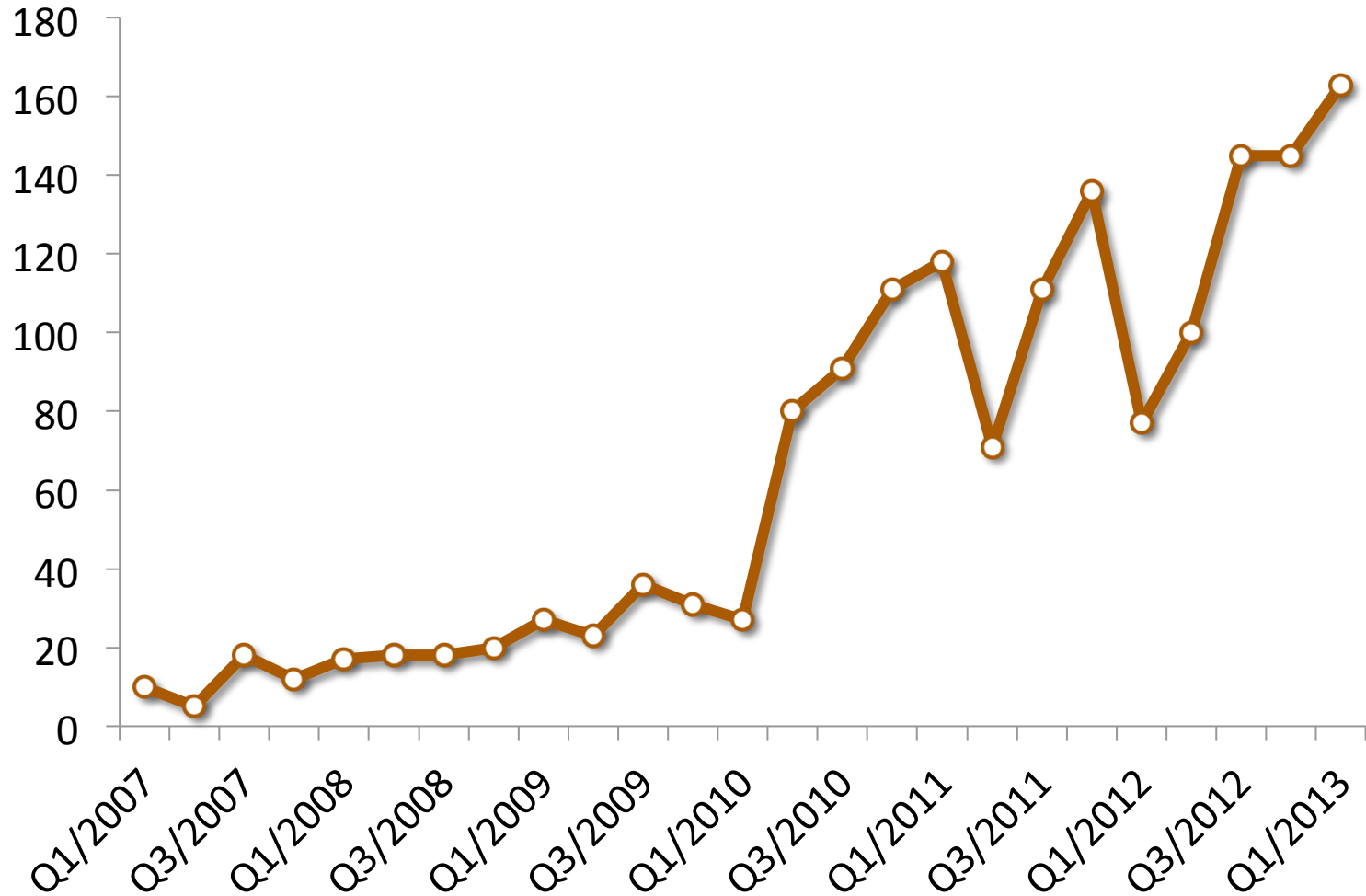
