




#### Metropolitan Washington's foreign-born population grew by I million immigrants between 1990 and 2010



At the turn of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, Eastern and Midwestern places had large shares of immigrants...



...by 2010, the immigrant presence in some places have dwindled, while Washington's has increased



With the exception of San Francisco, the 20 largest immigrant destinations in 1900 were in the Midwest or Northeast






#### Metropolitan Washington's foreign-born population grew by I million immigrants between 1990 and 2010






### The immigrant population in the Washington region is diverse: no one nationality has a majority







#### Region of Origin, 2010


