







Share of GDP in Exports


















A Metro Area Is Defined by Its Economic Function




Metro Areas Hold the Bulk of the Country's Assets that Will Drive the Next Economy



Metro Areas Generate the Majority of GDP in 47 of the 50 States




In Kansas, Six Metro Areas Drive the State's Economy






