




#### The Core Problem: The Bulk of U.S. Growth Came from Non-Tradeable Sectors











#### Growth in Exports Can Support Job Creation in the U.S.





#### Venture Capital Top 100 Metro Share



#### Air Freight Top 100 Metro Share




#### Metro Areas Also Generate a Moderate Share of Agricultural Exports


