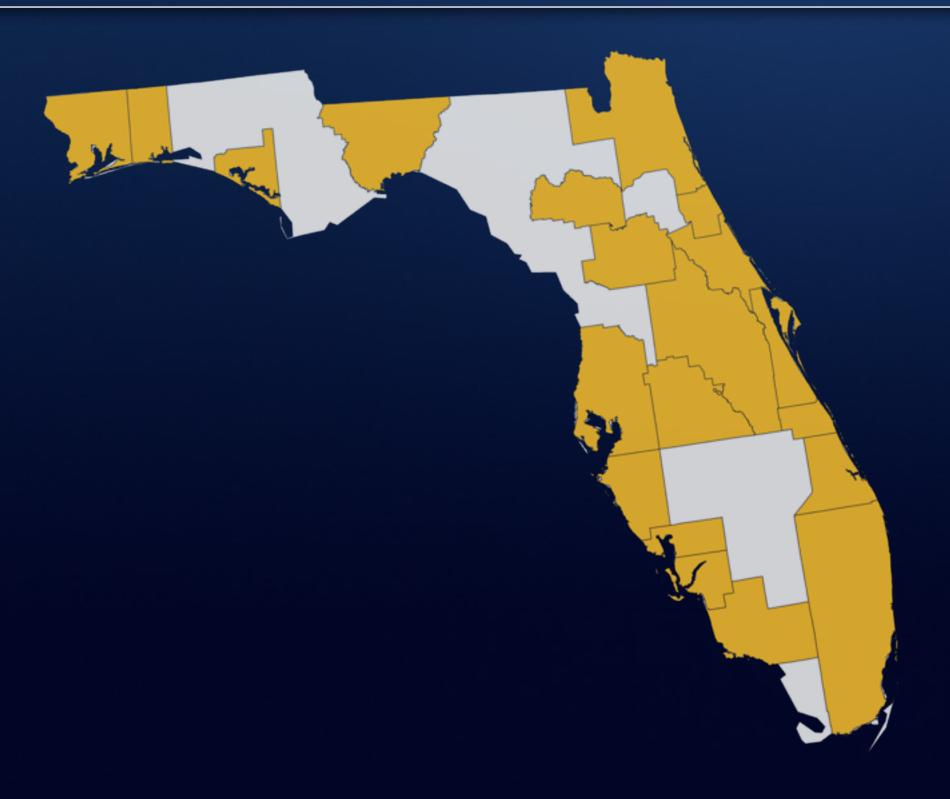

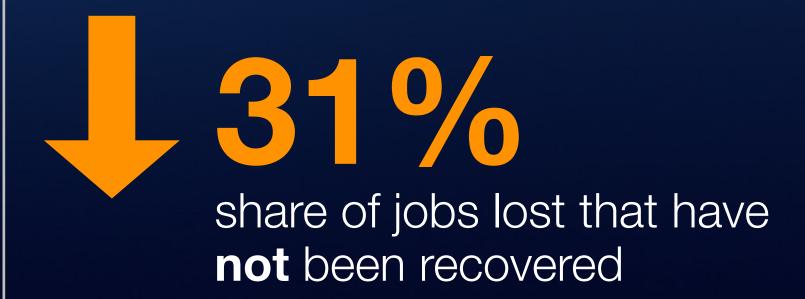

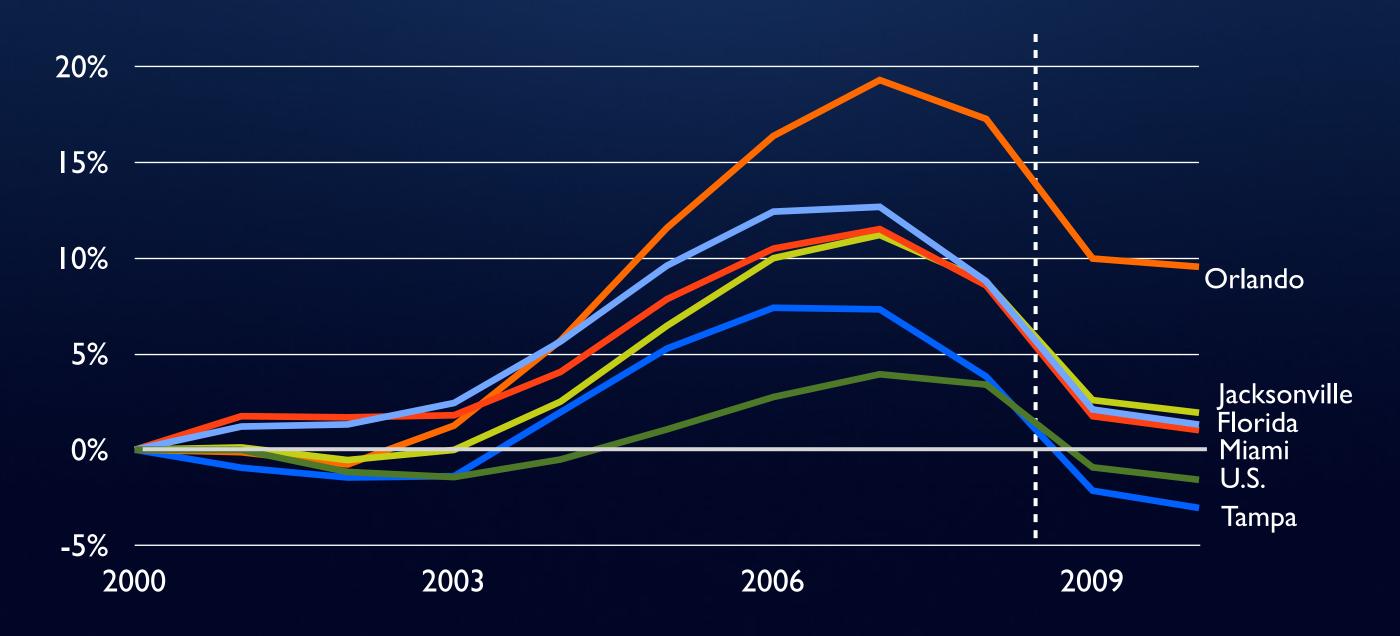
### The Middle Class Has Been Hit Especially Hard by This Recession



decline in median income of working-age households, 2000-2010

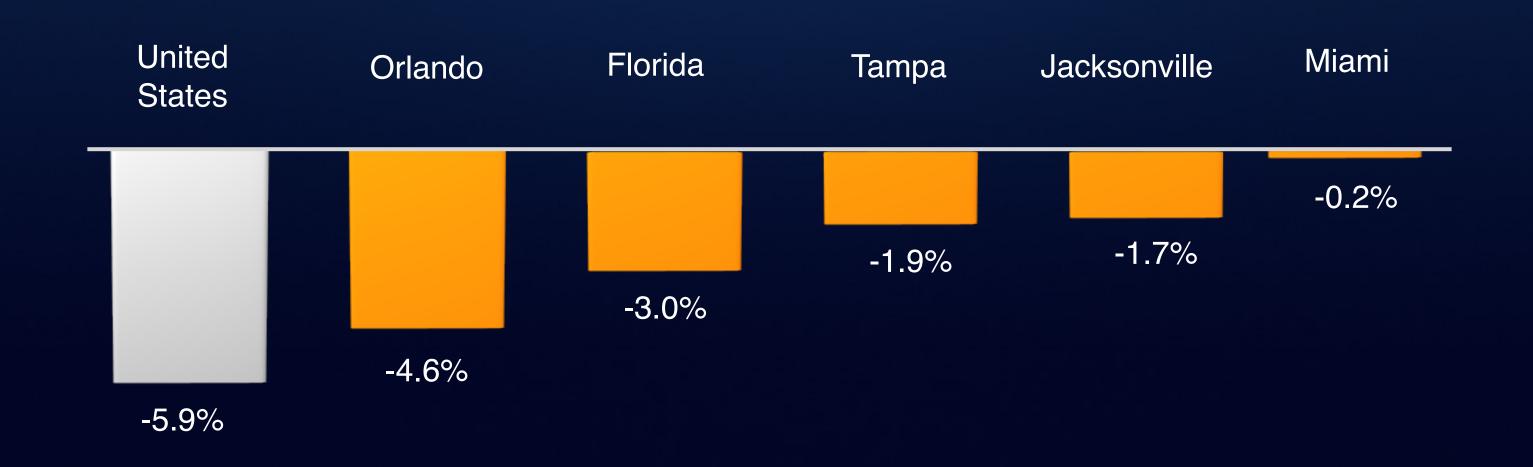

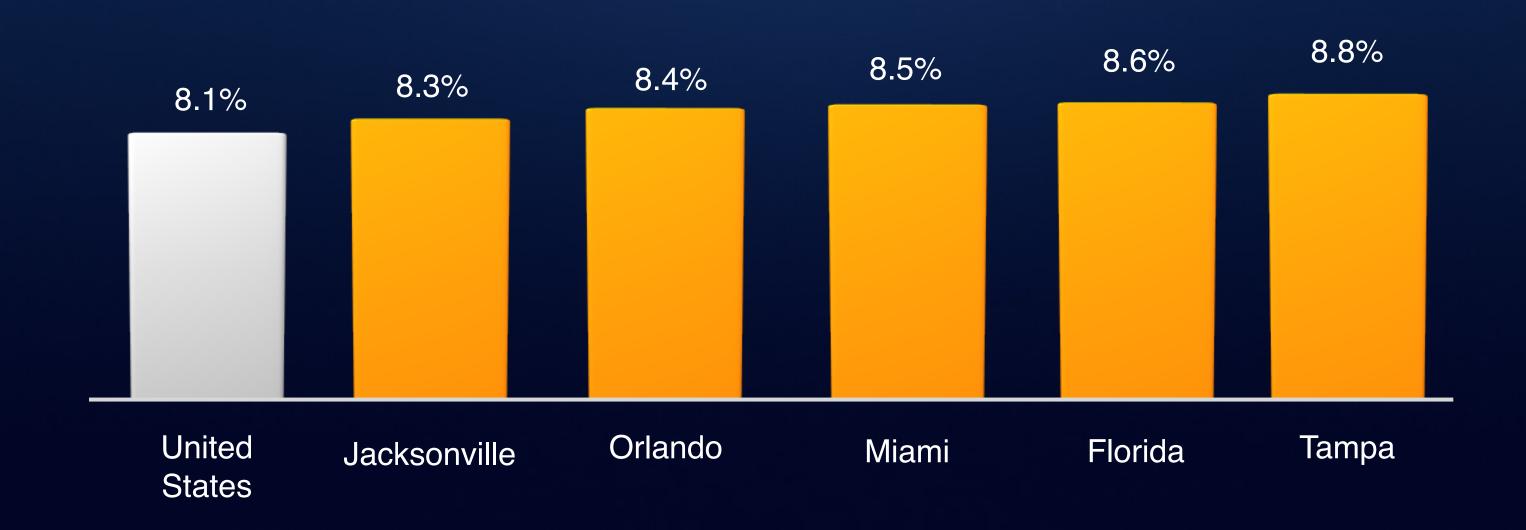

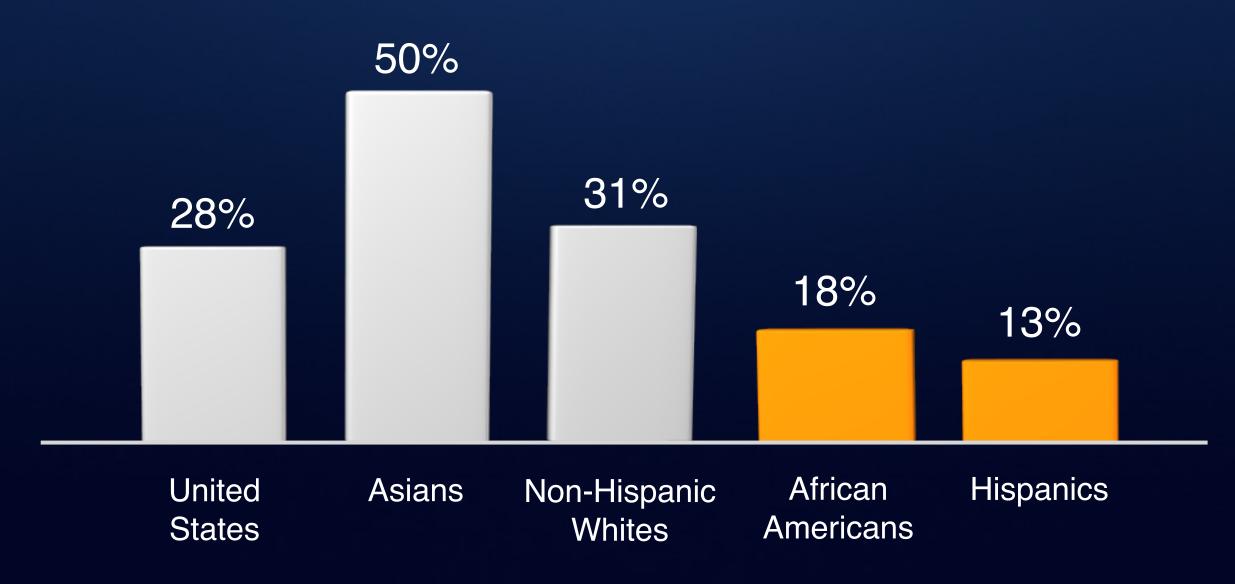

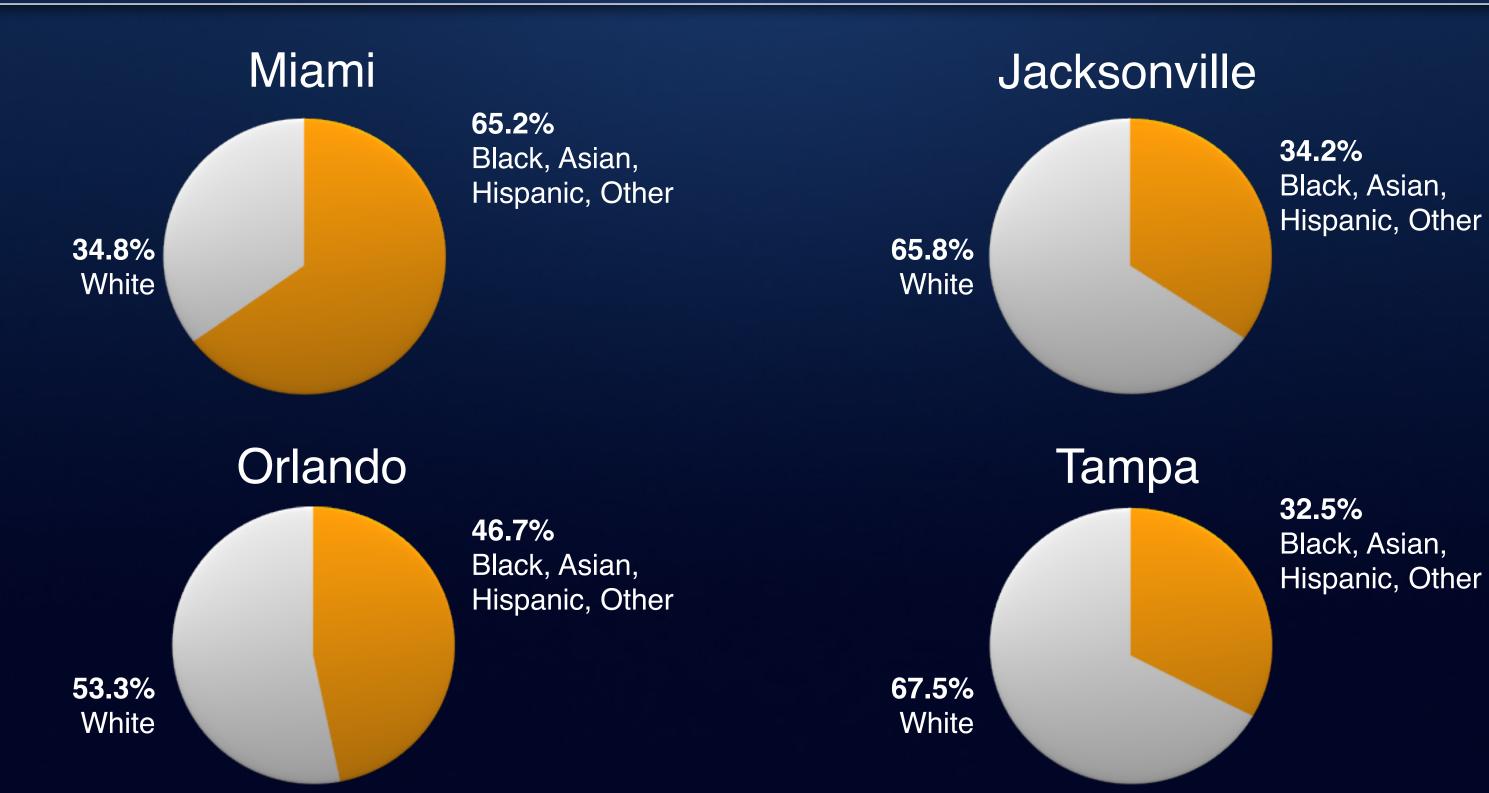

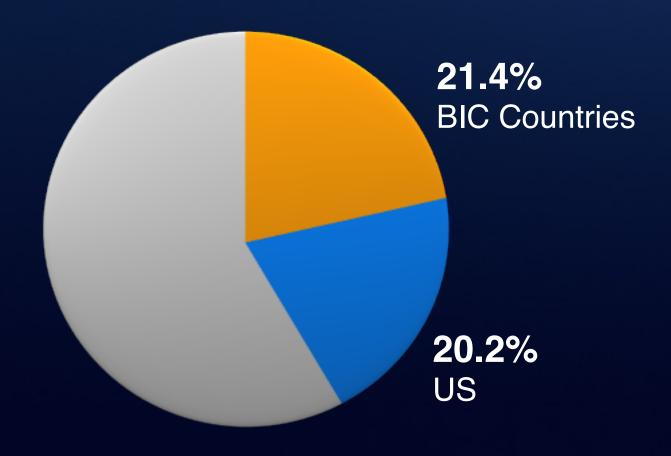

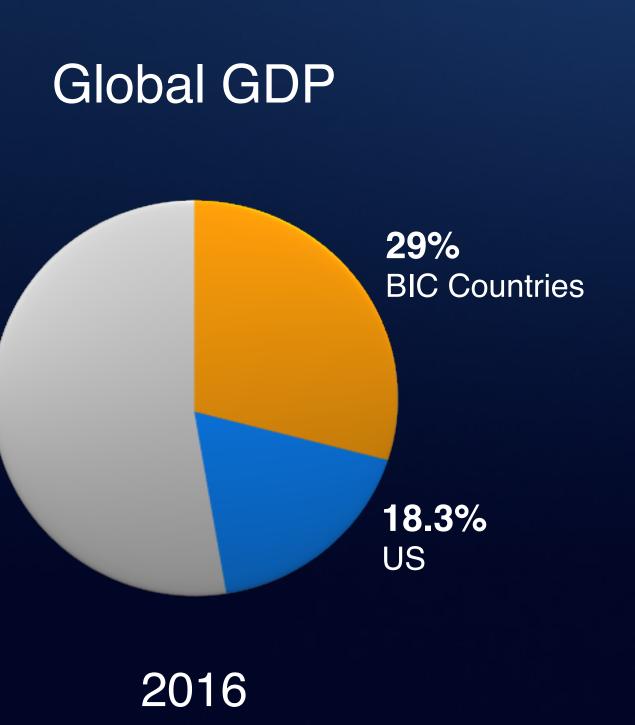

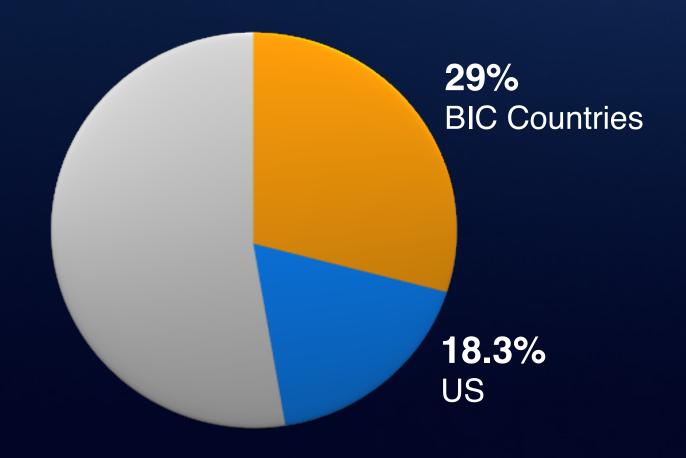

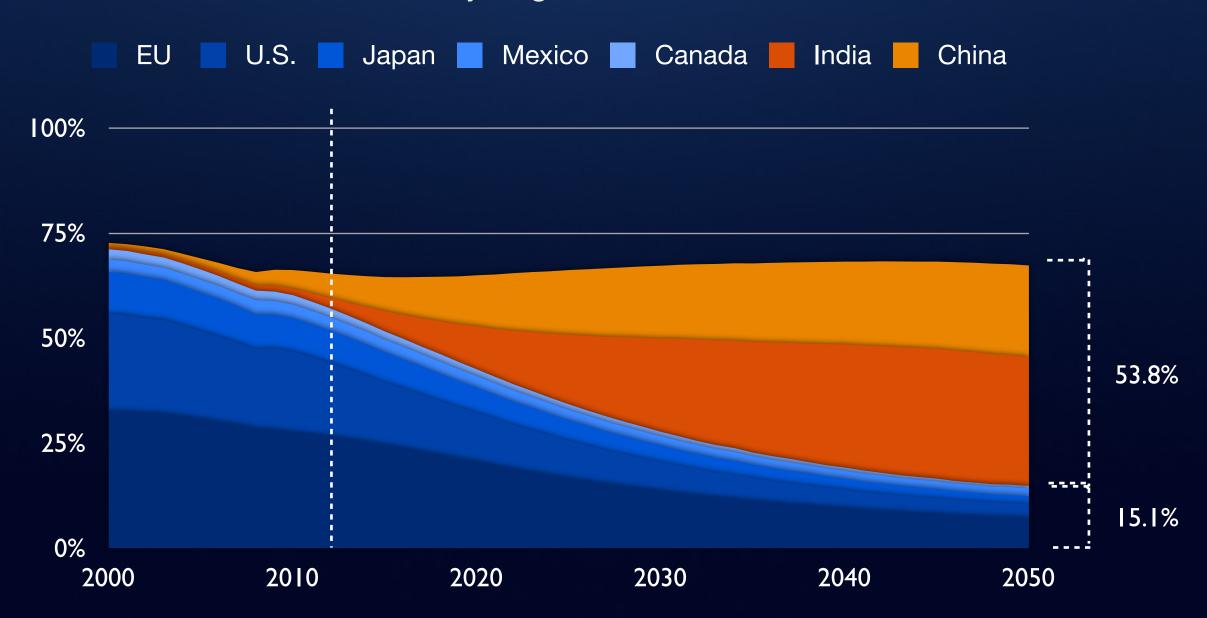

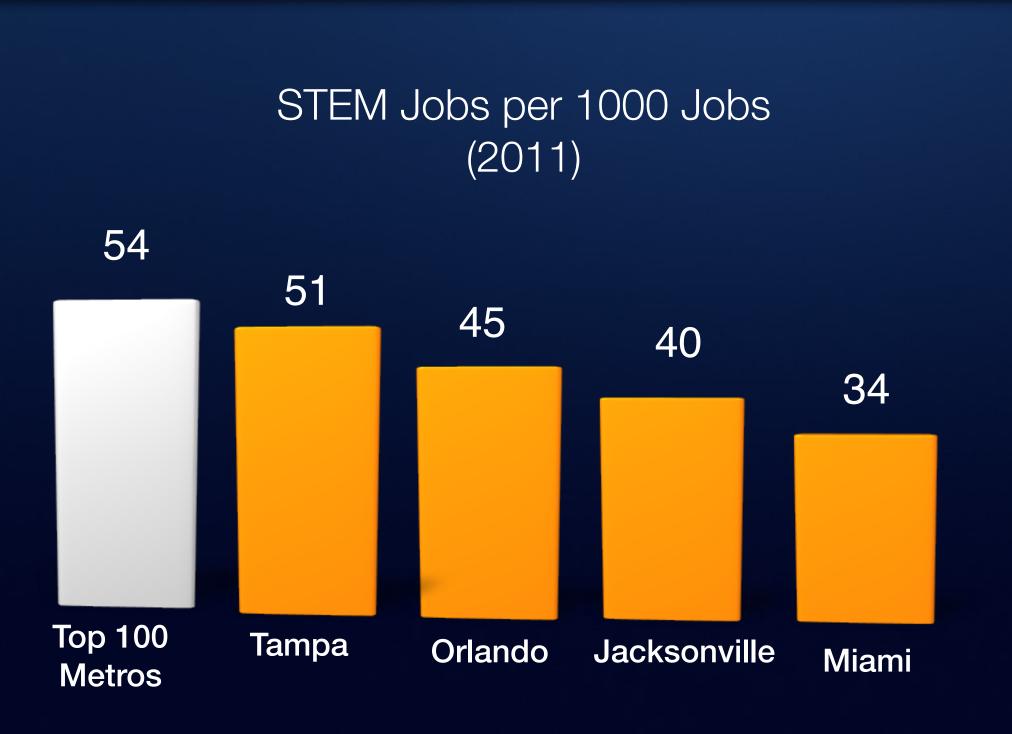

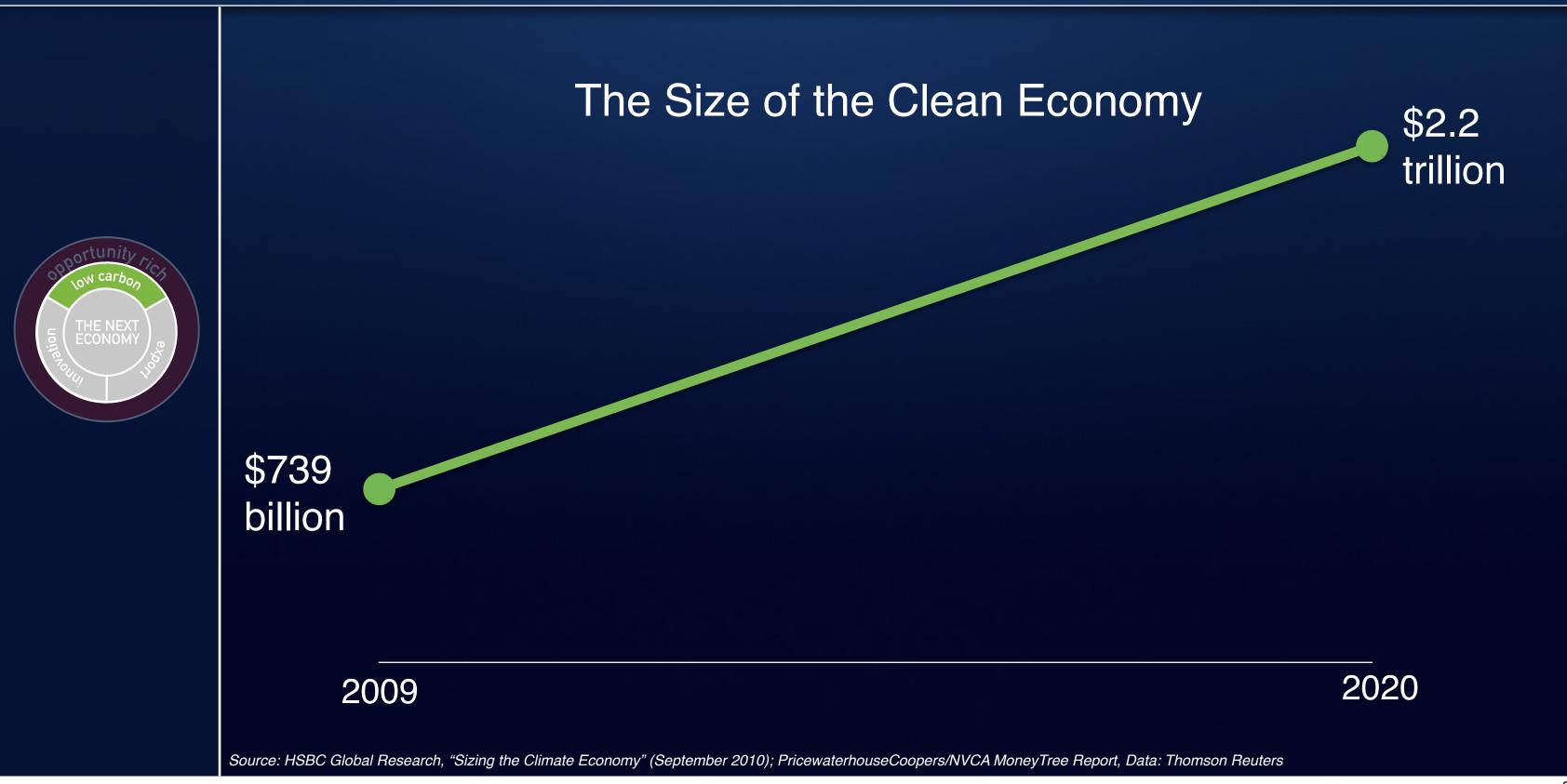

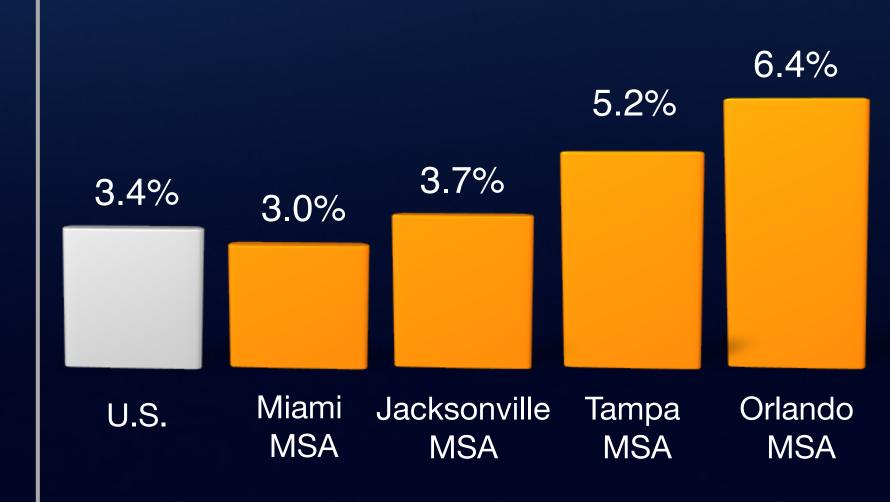

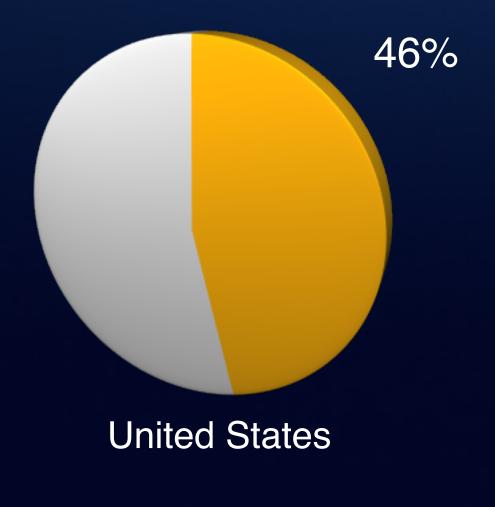

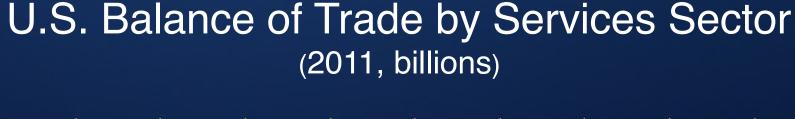

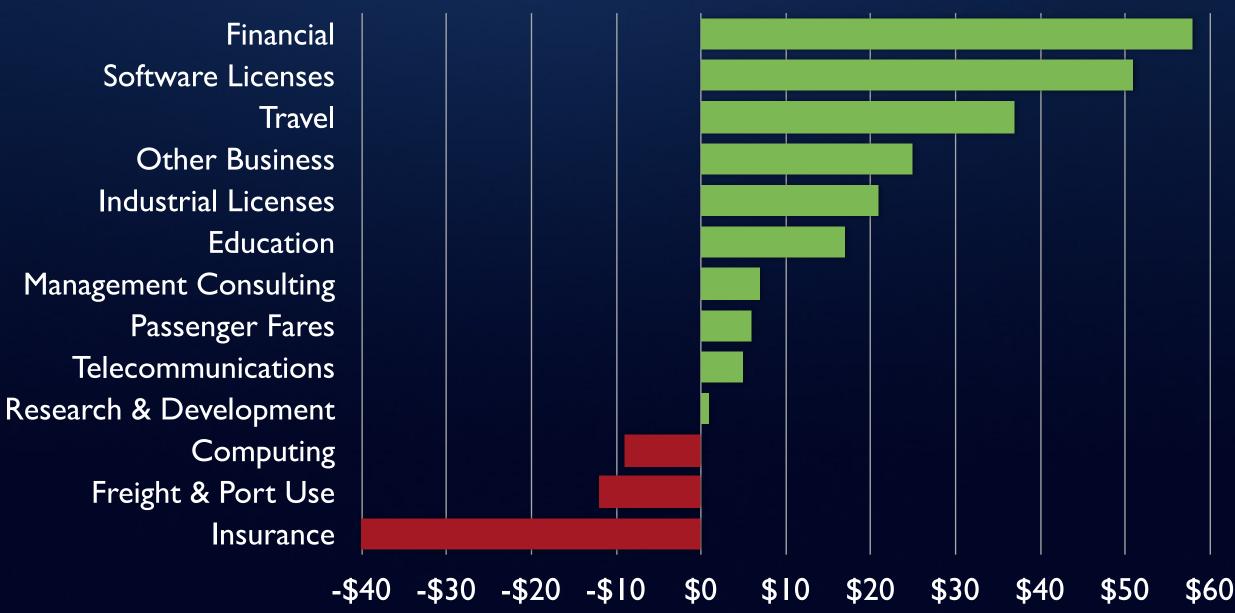

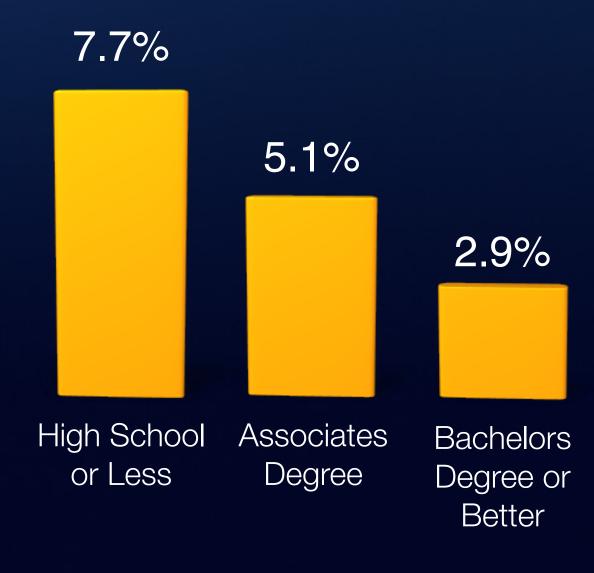

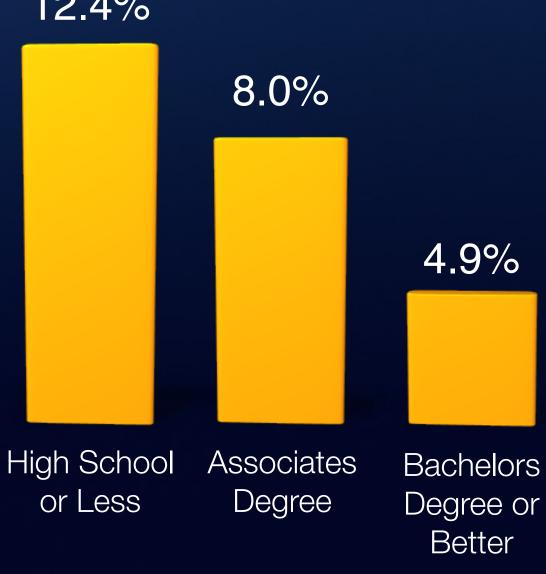

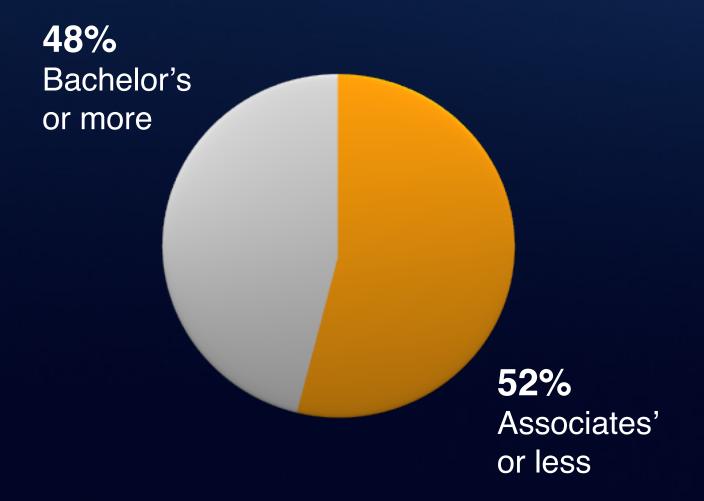
# STEM Jobs by Degree Required Tampa MSA, 2011

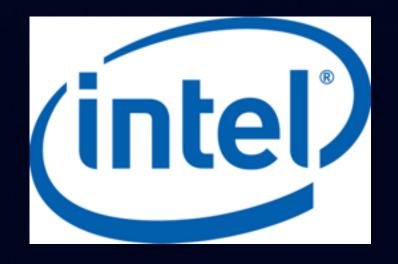

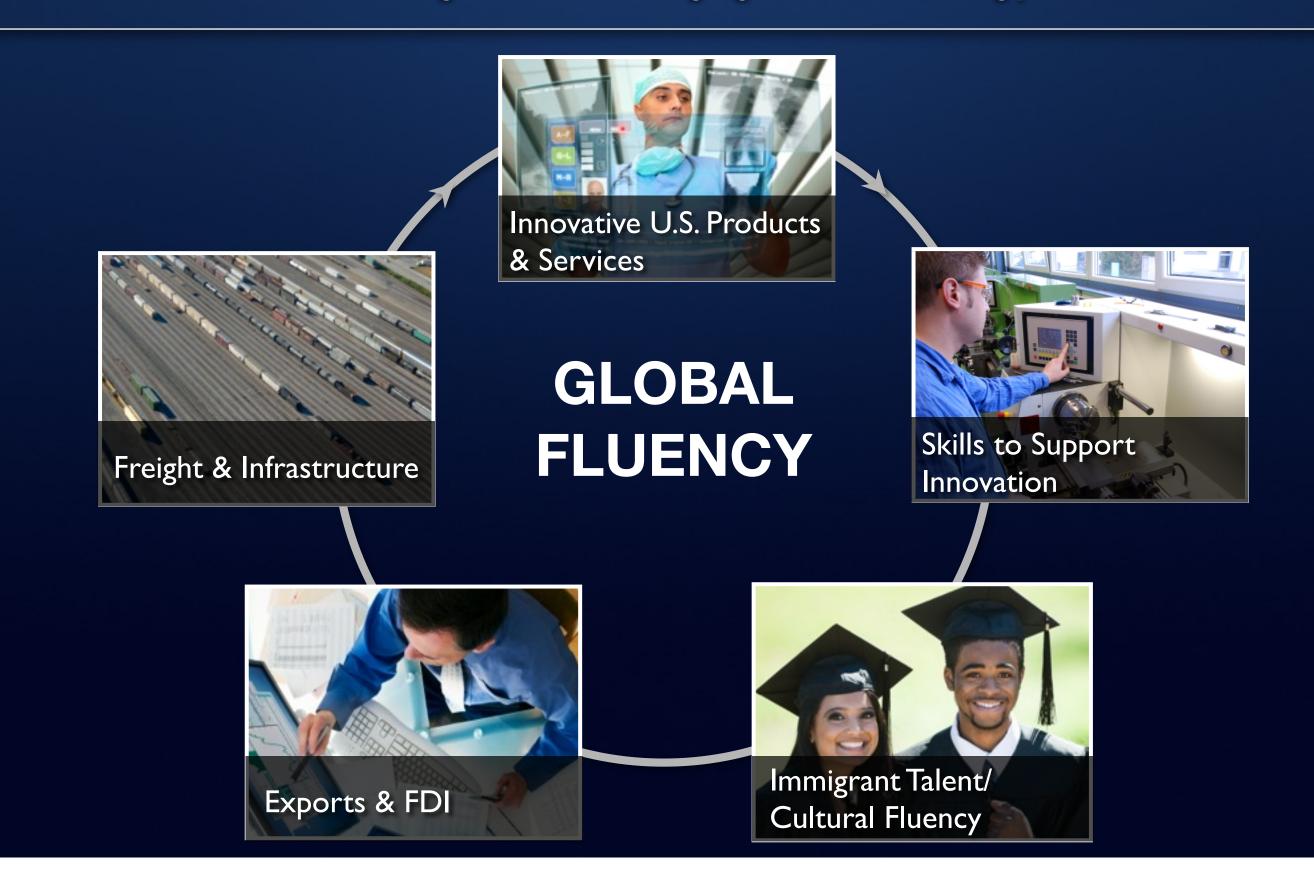
