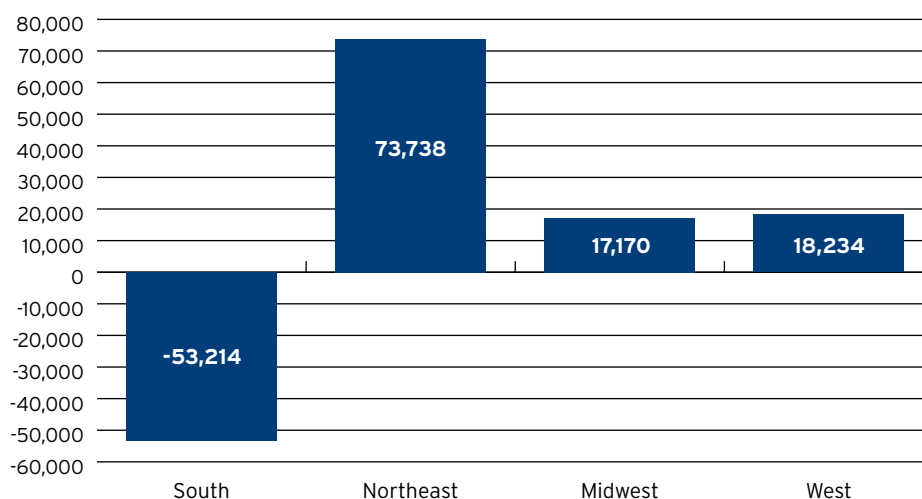

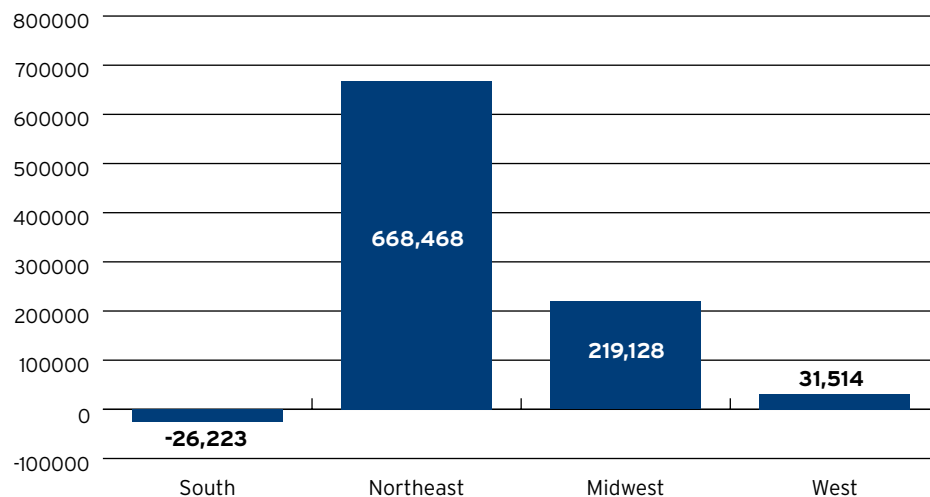

**Figure 1A. Virginia: Net Migration Exchanges with Regions of the U.S., 2000-2007**



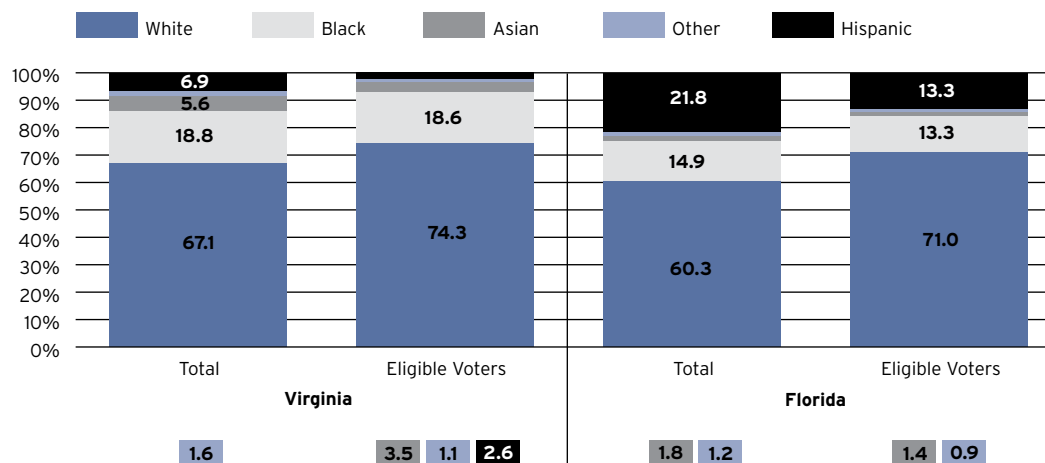

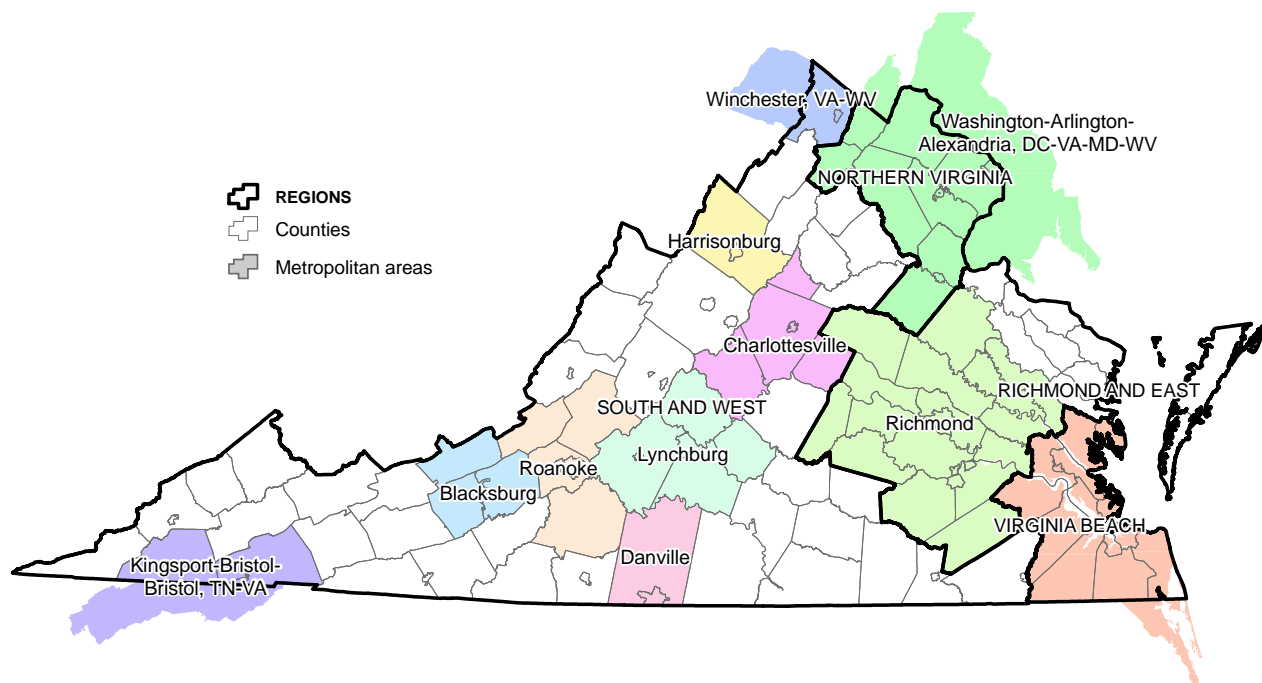

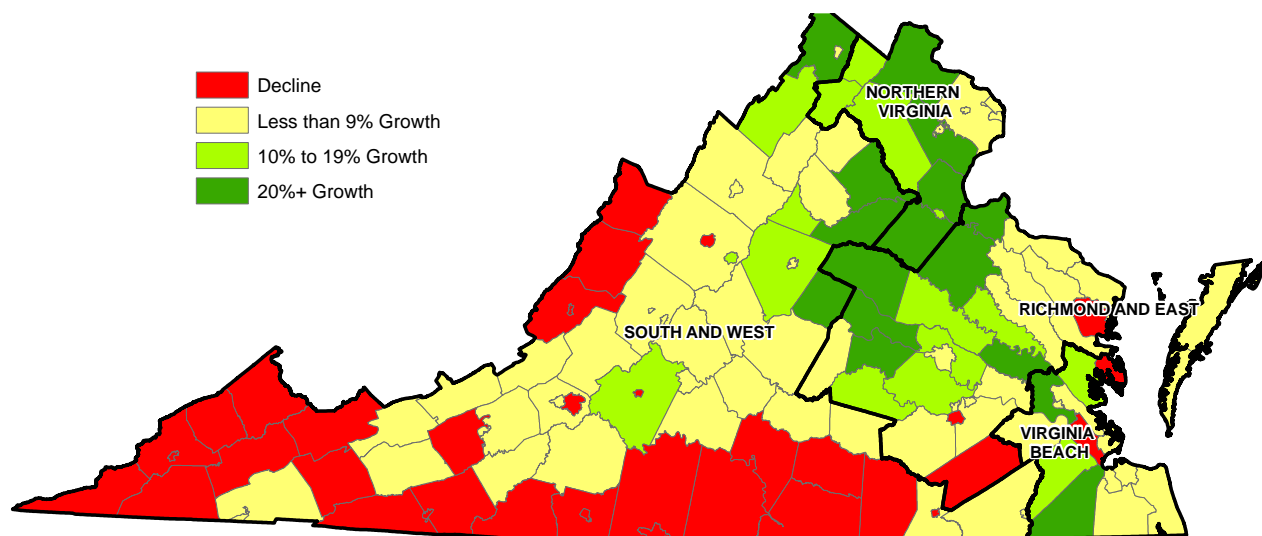

Map 1. Virginia Metropolitan Areas and Regions

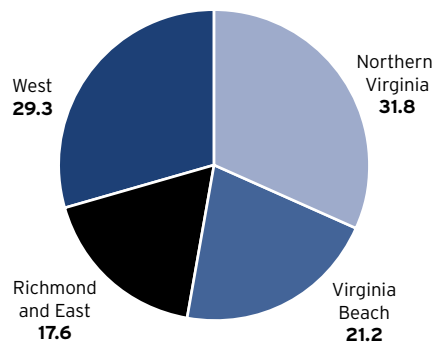


Map 2. Virginia Population Change by County, 2000-2007



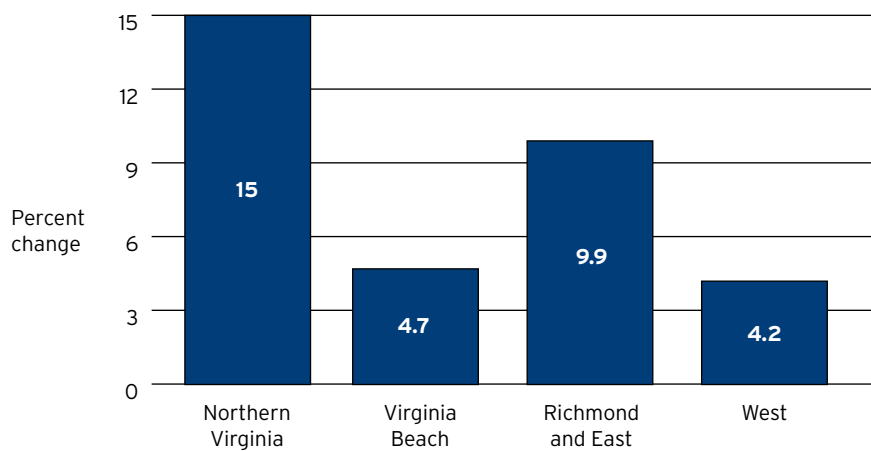

**Figure 4. Population Growth in Virginia Regions, 2000-2007**



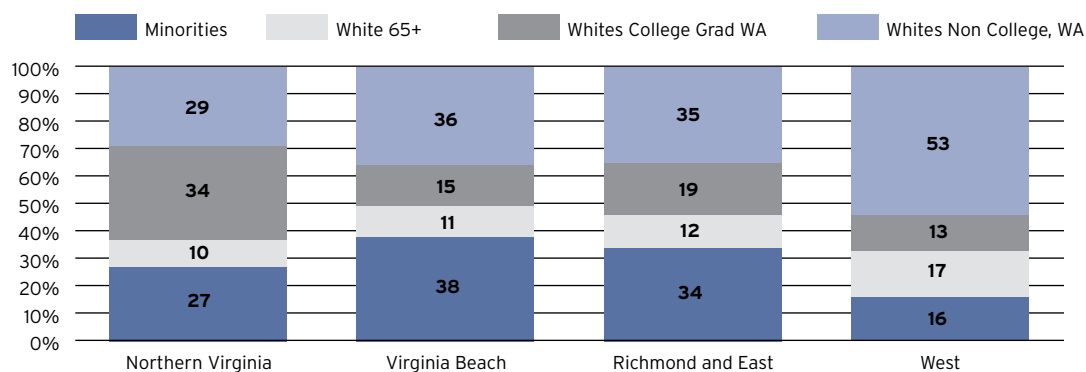

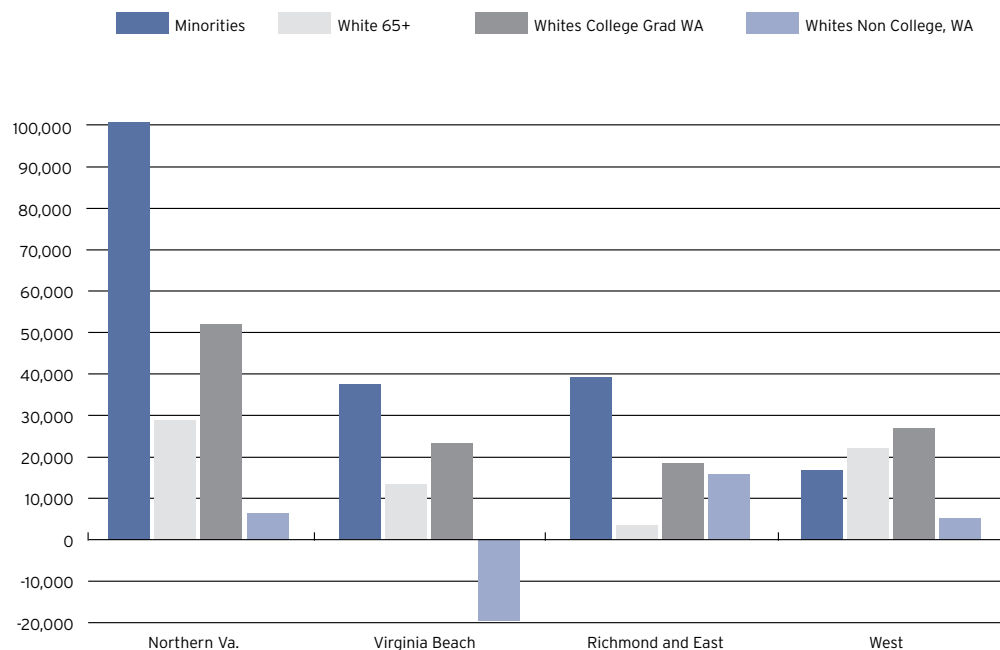

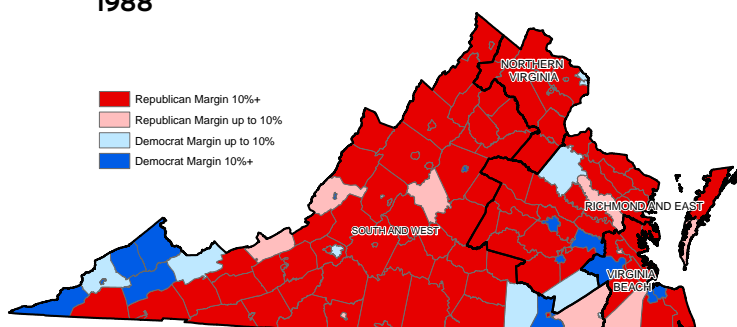

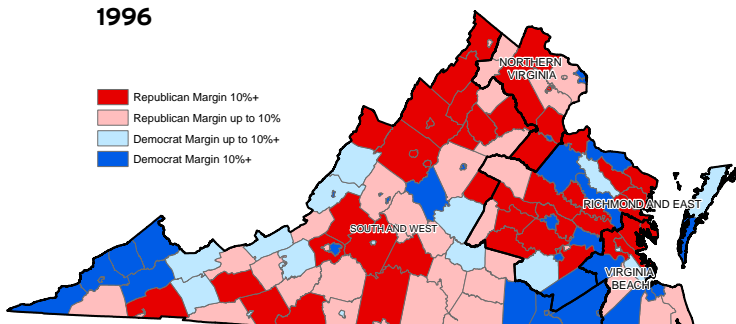

Maps 3A-3C. Virginia County Presidential Voting, 1988-2004

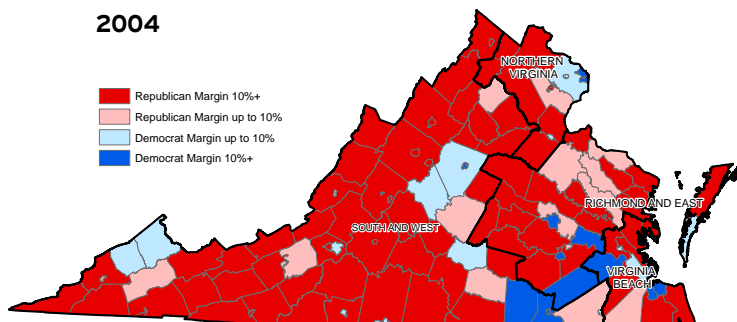
