## B Next Economy: State Profiles

## **New York**

The interconnected cities, suburbs, and surrounding rural towns that form metropolitan areas, particularly the nation's 100 largest, represent the engines of state economic growth and concentrate the assets critical to building the "Next Economy."

New York contains six of the nation's 100 largest metro areas, which account for 87 percent of the state's population, 87 percent of its jobs, and 91 percent of its economic output. Together, New York's 12 metro areas constitute 92 percent of the state's population, 93 percent of its jobs, and 95 percent of its economic output.


