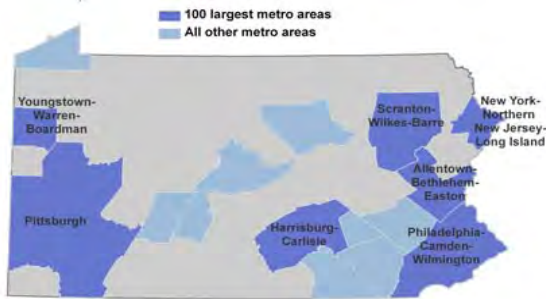




Pennsylvania

The interconnected cities, suburbs, and surrounding rural towns that form metropolitan areas, particularly the nation's 100 largest, represent the engines of state economic growth and concentrate the assets critical to building the "Next Economy."

Pennsylvania contains seven of the nation's 100 largest metro areas, which account for 66 percent of the state's population, 69 percent of its jobs, and 72 percent of its economic output. Together, Pennsylvania's 16 metro areas constitute 84 percent of the state's population, 87 percent of its jobs, and 89 percent of its economic output.
