

## Delphi Survey: AMISOM Contributing Countries Continued Provision of Troops

### Overview

**Thank you for participating in this survey. It aims to gather estimative data from scholars on whether one or more countries contributing troops to the African Union Mission in Somalia (AMISOM)—Burundi, Djibouti, Ethiopia, Kenya, Uganda—will prematurely withdraw all troops from AMISOM.
