



US race/ethnic profiles by age group




Population Age Distributions, 1980 and 2015










Share of marriages that are interracial

Generational differences: currently married by age 25-34





Homeownership by Race: Age 25-34






Millennial Population Growth, 2010-2015











Millennials: minority shares of state populations

Millennial Racial Profiles of Urban-Suburban Areas







Millennials, age 25-34: percent in poverty








Cultural Generation Gap: white share differences across generations





States with the largest cultural generation gaps






Share of people who agree: "Since 1950, American culture has mostly changed for the better"


Aging of the Millennial Population










