Survey Methodology (September 2019)

The survey was carried out September 3-20, 2019 online from a nationally representative sample of Nielsen Scarborough's probability-based panel, originally recruited by mail and telephone using a random sample of adults provided by Survey Sampling International. The poll was conducted among a national poll of 3,016 respondents, with a margin of error of \pm 1.78%. Overall, the sample was adjusted to reflect population estimates (Scarborough USA+/Gallup) for Americans. The survey variables balanced through weighting were: age, gender, race/ethnicity, household income, level of education, census regional division, and political party affiliation.


Survey Methodology (October 2019)

The survey was carried out October 4-10, 2019 online from a nationally representative sample of Nielsen Scarborough's probability-based panel, originally recruited by mail and telephone using a random sample of adults provided by Survey Sampling International. The poll was conducted among a national poll of 1,260 respondents (958 for the Syria question), with a margin of error of \pm 2.76%. Overall, the sample was adjusted to reflect population estimates (Scarborough USA+/Gallup) for Americans. The survey variables balanced through weighting were: age, gender, race/ethnicity, household income, level of education, census regional division, and political party affiliation.








Do you approve or disapprove of the way the U.S. government is handling Iran?








To achieve its current goal vis-àvis Iran, the U.S. should be prepared to go to war.




If sufficient evidence emerges that Iran is responsible, should the U.S. consider a military action in response?

Now tell me, which one do you think is most important in explaining the escalation in the Gulf?



How much have you heard about BDS, or the Boycott, Divestment, and Sanctions movement aimed at Israel?








Do you think the U.S. should increase troops, maintain current troop levels, decrease troops, or remove all troops from Afghanistan in the next year?






