The Gender Equality in and through Education Team (GEET) at the Center for Universal Education (CUE) works to advance the status of gender-transformative research, policy making, and practice in global education. GEET is committed to exploring participatory approaches to research, policy, and systems transformation, especially on issues related to gender and education. We seek to engage in deep collaborations with our partners to amplify and learn from local knowledges, practices, and actions to better understand what works to ensure transformative outcomes for gender equality and inclusion for systemically marginalized girls, women, and gender non-conforming people.

Our Projects

Echidna Global Scholars Program (EGSP) Started in 2012, the EGSP seeks to catalyze and amplify the impact of local leaders working to advance gender equality in and

through education across the Global South.

• EGS Visiting Fellowship

During a six-month fellowship, Echidna Global Scholars conduct research focused on improving learning opportunities and life outcomes for girls, young women, and gender non-conforming people, strengthen their leadership and evidence-based policy skills, build substantive knowledge on gender and global education issues and expand their pathways for impact.

• EGS Alumni Network

Through the *Echidna Global Scholar Alumni Network*, CUE partners with 36 alumni in 19 countries driving evidence-based change to eliminate gender-based discrimination in policies, practices, and social norms,

transform education, and improve learning opportunities and life outcomes for girls and young women globally.

The Learning Action Alliance for Girls Agency (LAAGA)

LAAGA is a community of practice comprised of 23 leaders in gender equality and education, working in 17 countries across Africa, America, Asia and the Middle East. LAAGA co-constructs a ground-based practical framework for understanding the nuanced nature of the development and exercise of girls' agency in diverse, local contexts. Grounded in feminist and collaborative approaches to development practice, as well as strengthsbased inquiry, the LAAGA methodology centers the knowledge and experience of LAAGA members and is guided by principles of flexibility, action-reflection, and participation.
