- Led development of innovative, evidence-based programs such as Vision for Baltimore (an initiative to provide glasses to every child who needs them), B'More for Healthy Babies (a collective impact strategy with over 150 public/private partners, resulting in a 38 percent reduction of infant mortality in just seven years), and Safe Streets (a program to engage returning citizens and hospitals in treating gun violence as a contagious disease).
- Convened hospitals, FQHCs, businesses, nonprofits, and community members around shared goals to develop citywide blueprint for health equity—Healthy Baltimore 2020—that aims to cut health disparities in half in ten years.
