Why our work matters

The global economic and social system is at a critical juncture. Although globalization has brought tremendous benefits to the world, including prosperity for millions of people, these benefits continue to be unevenly distributed. As evidenced by continuing unequal economic recovery since the COVID-19 pandemic, geopolitical tensions, and slow climate response, the costs of globalization have not been sufficiently managed in policy responses.

The Global Economy and Development program at the Brookings Institution is playing its part to ensure that the future of globalization is one of broadly shared and sustainable prosperity. With its interdisciplinary team of experts, issue-focused centers, and collaboration with key partners, the Global program provides thought leadership, cutting-edge research, and actionable solutions that deepen cooperation and guide relevant policies for some of the most pressing issues of our time.

Our research focus

The Global Economy and Development program addresses key global challenges by focusing on five intersecting and interrelated priority areas:

Technology for inclusive growth and development

Explores how technological innovations can be deployed to address and even leapfrog development challenges to chart new growth paths.

Climate policy and action for sustainable and inclusive growth and development

Proposes new frameworks to assess the net benefits of low-carbon economies and offers practical solutions to safer climate economic systems.

Global education and skills development

Informs the development of policy related to global education challenges and promotes actionable strategies for governments, civil society, and private enterprises.

Sustainable development and financing for development

Empowers local, national, and global policy leaders with rigorous data-driven insights, practical tools, and accountability metrics that help accelerate the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals.

Renewed multilateralism and international cooperation

Proposes solutions for a renewed multilateral architecture and improved international cooperation, with special emphasis on the needs of developing countries that are often left out of global debates.



Our centers and initiatives

Africa Growth Initiative

The Africa Growth Initiative (AGI) at Brookings conducts high-quality, independent research, which helps establish long-term strategies for economic growth and strong policies for development in Africa. The ultimate goal of AGI's work is to inform policy that makes a difference in the lives of the people of Africa. AGI's research is designed to create strong policy capable of creating sustained economic growth and development throughout the region.

Center for Sustainable Development

The Center for Sustainable Development (CSD) is a knowledge hub and convener that helps distill key sustainable development challenges, generate leading insights, accelerate promising solutions, and equip leaders around the world to drive their own change toward the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and related priorities.

With the world facing a variety of crises, the SDGs continue to form a crucial reference point for charting a new course toward economic, social, and environmental progress within and across all countries by 2030.

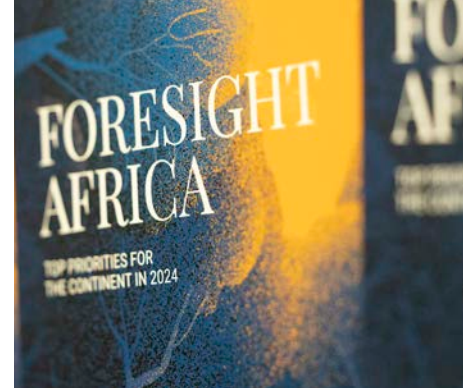
Center for Universal Education

USMCA initiative

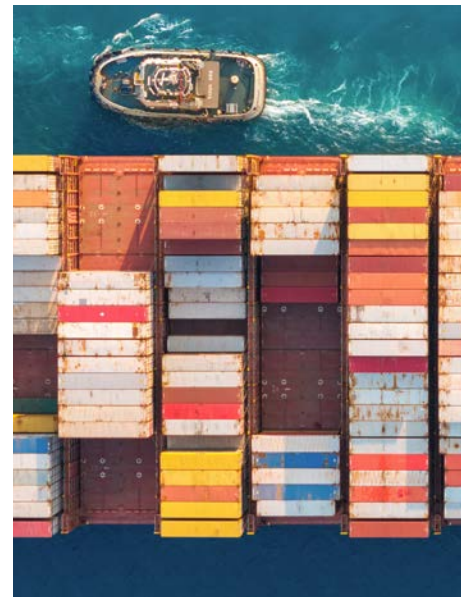
In 2020, the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) came into effect, replacing the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) and providing a new framework for North American trade relations. The Brookings USMCA initiative works to measure the effectiveness and implementation of the agreement, as well as its impact on the policies and economies of the partner nations through forward-looking research, data, and analyses.

The Forum for Cooperation on Artificial Intelligence

The Forum for Cooperation on Artificial Intelligence (FCAI), a collaboration between the Brookings Institution and the Centre for European Policy Studies, hosts regular AI dialogues among high-level officials from seven governments (Australia, Canada, EU, Japan, Singapore, U.K., and the U.S.) as well as experts from industry, civil society, and academia, aimed at identifying opportunities for international cooperation on AI regulation, standards, and research and development.

Workforce of the Future initiative

At the core of the Workforce of the Future initiative is a body of research that uncovers local economic growth strategies to create high-wage jobs in fast-growing sectors of the economy. The research puts a spotlight on who is falling behind, where, and by how much. It also identifies career pathways that should be expanded to improve economic opportunity for those being left behind.

The Global program and research teams highlight and deepen the public's understanding of some of the most pressing and consequential global issues and challenges.

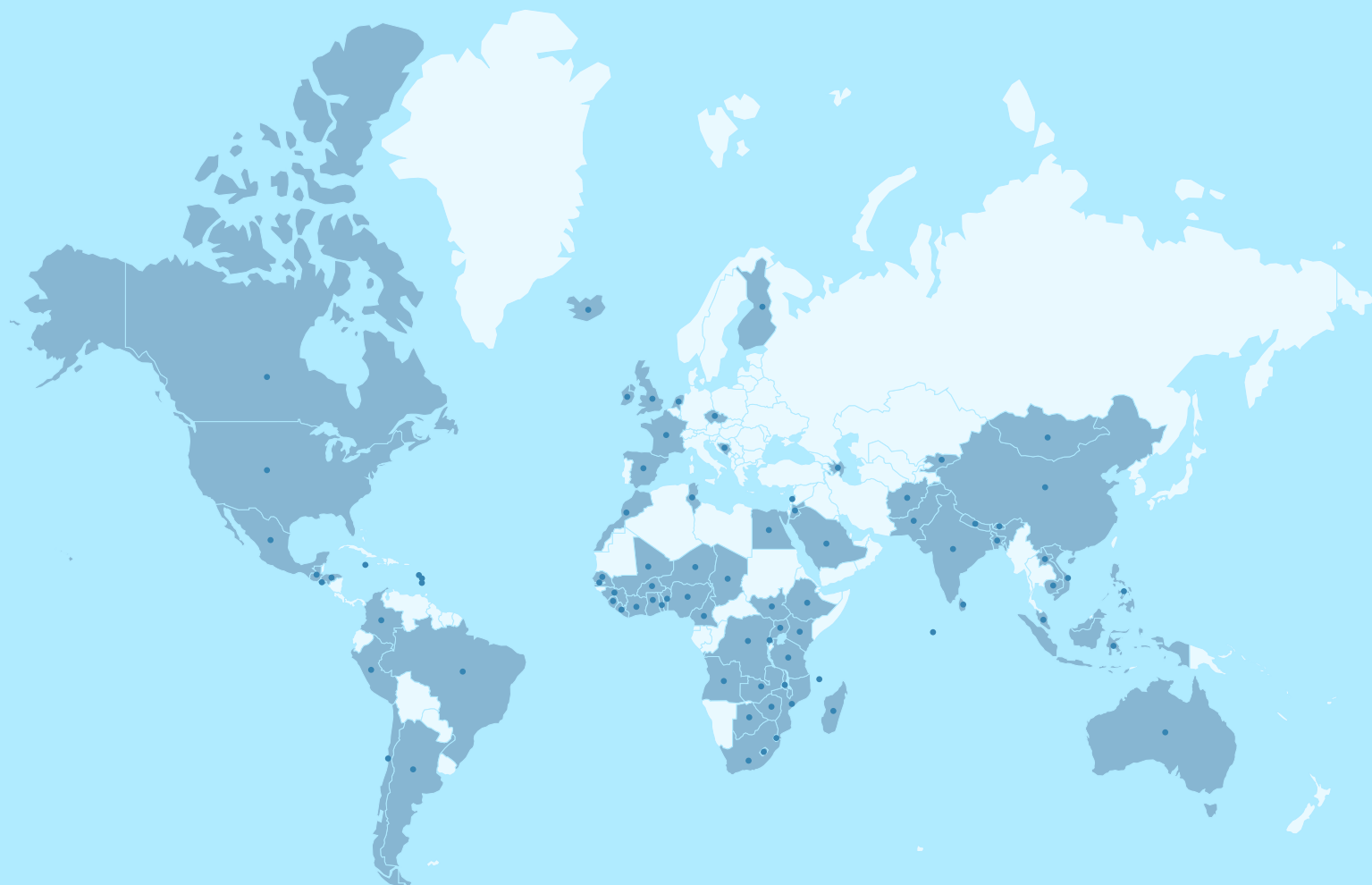


Convening Power

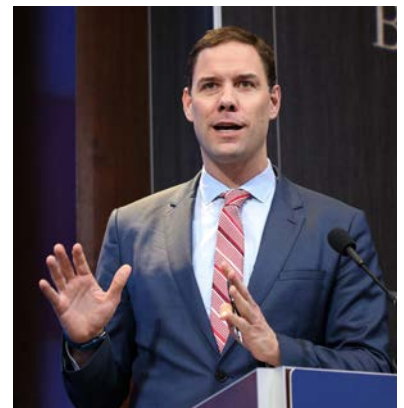
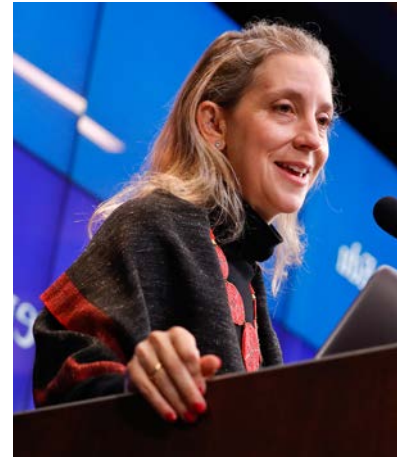
